He started by looking at available books, reading only the words he could and skipping them, he couldn't, which he soon found to be completely useless. It wasn't until he got to norfolk prison colony that he finally realized what he really needed was a dictionary. He began to study the pages, looking over all the words that he had never known, even existed. Then he began to copy the words down his pills- word by word, page of the day, he would write it all down, then read aloud his handwriting. He also realized that he began to remember the meaning of each word that really excited him. He began to go faster and faster using the dictionary, finishing every letter of the alphabet, which eventually led to him finishing the entire dictionary with the acquired understanding of all these new words. He felt as if he had never been free until he fully understood how to read and understand literature (197). He began to read from the teachings of Elijah Muhammad and thus became very interested in black history and slavery. This led him to become Minister of Muhammad and led him to fight for African-American civil rights. The book after the book showed me how the white man had brought ... different human beings. I saw how since the sixteenth century, the so-called Christian-trader white man began to hone the sea in his lust for the Asian and African empires and power. Malcolm X didn't always believe that and also John Taylor Gatto, who wrote the article Why Schools Don't Educate. Gatto believed that schools did not allow children to be independent. If schools did not allow children to be independent than children did mentally alive, it held the child back from actual education. When they are in school, children focus on time rather than actual tasks, making them likely to fail because they lost the real meaning of education. Gatto stated: The homeschooling movement has quietly grown to size, where one and a half million young people are educated fully with their Parents. Last month an education spokesperson reported the amazing news that children schooled at home seemed to be five or ten years ahead of their officially trained peers in their ability to think. (1) This suggests that students who have been given time to actually study and stay focused on one subject without time are more likely to succeed than a child attending school. Given students' sense that they have a spiritual life to be able to embrace Malcolm X, the great man who inspired many people was not always an educated man.
