The footnotes and bibliography have also been substantially updated to reflect the latest scholarship, debate, critical methods, and the continued search of historical Jesus. Jesus and the Gospels are divided into five major sections: (1) Historical background for studying the Gospels, (2) Critical methods of studying the Gospels, (3) Introduction to the four gospels, (4) A study of Christ's life, and (5) Historical and theological vision. The reader is sure to appreciate Blomberg's overall organization as it builds a foundation for the study therein. Section one guides the reader through the political, religious and socio-economic backgrounds of the gospels. Blomberg is consistently helpful in this regard and has provided a number of charts and tables throughout to help the reader better understand the timeline of events and material presented. Section two introduces the reader to historical and literary criticism of the gospels. This is an excellent introduction for the reader to grapple with the issues surrounding Synoptic Problem, Markan Priority, Q-Hypothesis, Redaction Critique, formation of the canon, narrative criticism, etc. This section is quite short, but consists of some of the best material in the book – especially as an introduction. Section three begins the review of the four gospels and provides the reader with the typical introductory material, such as authorship, structure, date, theology, etc. Section four delineates an examination of Jesus' life. This section starts with an excellent treatment of the questions surrounding the search for the historical Jesus and subsequently guides the reader through Christ's life in the gospel narrative. In addition to referring to specific passages in the Gospels, Blomberg has also included the section numbers from kurt aland's widely used synopsis — making it useful for the reader to cross-reference within Synoptics and beyond. This section consists of the majority of the book and with good reason. Section five rounds off the study with a healthy discussion about the credibility of gospels—a that Blomberg had published between the first and second editions of this work—and Jesus theology is found in the Gospels. Even seven years after the second edition of Blomberg's Jesus and the Gospels, there is still good reason to praise this volume as one of the best resources available on the subject. The reader will consistently be helped by Blomberg's eager ability to introduce and guide them through some of the darkest gospel waters. This is a book to be read cover-to-cover, but it is also an extremely useful reference. The latter is most evident in the plethora of useful graphs, charts and tables that are strewn throughout, as well as the curated bibliographies that complete each chapter for further study. Moreover, due to the unique availability of this volume, this is also a book that I foresee to be useful for lay-offs, and perhaps even the basis of an adult or Sunday school course.
