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Urban beach weekend miami 2020

They are crowded beaches and crammed nightclubs - U.S. students are more minded by Corona beer than coronavirus, and who for days ignored recommendations to keep their distance from each other as a precaution against a pandemic. But on Wednesday, some began to face reality. The spring break, enjoyed by U.S. colleges and universities, is the biggest season on the beach in Miami, an island city off the coast of Miami with enticing sand along a neon-lit bar of restaurants, nightclubs and bars. Elsewhere in the United States, cities in the United States have become dead zones this week, cancelling major league sports and other events, closing bars and restaurants and staying at home to prevent the deadly spread of COVID-19 disease, which has infected more than 7,700 people and killed more than 110 people, including seven in Florida. Under the Florida sun, though, the beaches were still full of swimmers and sunshine, especially in Miami Beach, although the area now has to close after dark. Viral photos showing the thrones of young people lying on the sand and lying in seaside bars during parties have sparked unpleasant reactions on social media. Even President Donald Trump took note of scolding young vacationers during Wednesday's press conference. He warned them that they could pose a risk to other people from contracting a contagious and deadly virus. We don't want them to choose, he said. And I see they gather, including on the beaches and including restaurants. In response to the spread of the virus, Miami-Dade County and the city of Miami Beach have taken steps - not always successful - to complete this year's party season. You are not invincible, Miami Beach Mayor Dan Gelber said Tuesday. And you have to think about the person next to you and even the person you don't know. You have to stop this kind of activity now, he told the kids to visit his city. It's not fun and it has devastating consequences. Miami has ordered bars, nightclubs and gyms to close their doors from Tuesday at 11 a.m. until further notice, and restaurants can sell food only for withdrawal. A group of more than 10 people are banned from the district's parks and beaches - but in nearby South Beach on Wednesday, no one seemed to follow these instructions. Shelly Hill, a frustrated 21-year-old student living in neighboring Georgia, stood on a street corner with five friends trying to figure out what to do. A lot of things are getting close, Hill told AFP. At the same time, people need to be safe and quarantined, because it spreads really quickly. So I really don't know, Hill said. I have a lot of mixed emotions about how I feel the band decided to go home. From Tuesday to Wednesday, some seaside establishments decided to close completely. Even if waiters and other employees still receive a salary for their normal shifts, many of them will miss the advice, they often rely on where the custom is to leave 18-20 percent of the restaurant bill. Pizzeria worker Arquimedes Blandone sat outside a restaurant on one of the busiest streets in South Beach, bored and smoking a cigarette. Now there's not much to do for him. Everything is very serious, said the 33-year-old. This is the worst day we've had since we opened a year ago. The restaurant usually closes at 3:00 p.m., providing pizza for drunken partygoers milling around Miami Beach late at night. But now they will have to close at 10:00 a.m. after a tormenting slow day. He's totally dead. It's completely dead.
