Over a century later, the Roman writer Pliny the Elder wrote in Naturalis History (AD 77) Experience is the most effective teacher of all, and the Roman historian Tacitus simply said: Experience teaches, in his Histories (c. 209). The earliest English rendering appeared in 1539 as Experience is the mother of caution,Which was included in Richard Taverner's Proverbs or Adagies.. the exact formulation, Experience is the best teacher, appeared in the Widow Bedott Papers by Frances M.
