Manderley, of course, brings his shy second wife to live in wealthy widow Maxim de Winter (and where the sumptuous rooms are haunted by memories of Maxim's first wife Rebecca) is unfortunate, thoughtful British country estate. While Laurence Olivier and Joan Fontaine were nominated for Academy Awards for their roles, the star of the film was indeed Manderley. But, in detail in an article in the October 1998 issue of Victoria magazine, the house is not real-it was an architectural shell built for film on San Juan Island in Washington state. Director Alfred Hitchcock allegedly modeled the Bates house in Edward Hopper's the House by the Railroad. The sale of the house is currently pending, and you can see more photos here. 12 23 Grey Gardens Grey Gardens, a fascinating 1975 documentary by the Maysles brothers, chronicles the eccentric lives of reclusive socialites Little Edie and Big Edie Beale. The mother-daughter duo lived in a beachfront mansion in Grey Gardens, East Hampton, New York. Built in 1897, the once dazzling house had collapsed over the years as Beales' fortunes fell. After a series of inspections by the Suffolk County Health Department, which increased media attention in the early 70s, it was revealed that the crumbling residence was full of fleas and raccoons and filled with litter and cat waste. Fortunately, Big Edie's niece Jackie Onassis stepped up to help Beales repair their home and prevent eviction. Little Edie sold the house to former Washington Post editor Ben Bradlee in 1979. You can see what the magnificent 10-room manor house and surrounding gardens look like here right now. 13 23 Big Fish Tim Burton's 2003 film Big Fish Edward Bloom (Ewan McGregor / Albert Finney) follows fantastic life. The line between the stories of giants, witches and werewolons, and reality and meringe, is always blurred in his long stories, but we are particularly drawn to young Edward's discovery of the curious but charming town of Spectre, hidden behind a supposedly haunted forest. Years later, Edward returns to find that he has fallen into this dis maintained care for Spectre, and he, the character of Helena Bonham Carter, set out to renovate the charming but dilapidated summer house that Jenny.Fun actually belongs to: the town of Spectre is specially built for the film on a private island on the Alabama River outside Montgomery-and still exists! In the forgotten Southeast you can see photos of the now crumbling set covered in Spanish moss. 14 23 Steel Magnolias beautiful Louisiana home m'Lynn (Sally Field) and her family are just too cha cha for the words of the 1989 tearjerker Steel Magnolias house search. Located in Natchitoches Parish, the 5,900-square-foot brick-columned property saw the film operated as bed and breakfast until it was released in 2012. Built in 1840, the house once served as a hospital during the Civil War and has six bedrooms, a pool and its own 800-square-foot guest house. The house was auctioned in 2013 and is currently off the market. You .com about the Steel Magnolias house in Zillow, Turkey. The stone farmhouse, which was used for both interior and exterior shots in the 1830s, had been completely renamed before production began, and according to Zillow.com-producers even used the owner's own furniture, the property for the film was little changed. 17 23 Great Gatsby Okay, so Baz Luhrmann's Great Gatsby Jay Gatsby's palatial West Egg mansion exterior is the magic result of some CGI, but most of what you see is a real-life building in Sydney, Australia: an old seminar covered in fake ivy for the film. According to an article in Architectural Digest, it took the set design team 14 weeks to build, paint and decorate the interiors of Gatsby's estate alone, including the luxurious ballroom, library, master bedroom, entrance hall, terrace and gardens. It's also worth noting that we fully admire Nick Carraway's adjoining garden shed and Arts and Crafts-style interiors. 18 23 Beetlejuice Probably one of the scariest home makeovers in the history of cinema (especially if you are not a fan of avant garde architecture!) can be seen in the 1988 cult classic Beetlejuice. At the beginning of the film, Adam and Barbara Maitland (Geena Davis and Alec Baldwin) live in an antique old Connecticut farmhouse decorated with a traditional country aesthetic (four posters, Windsor chairs). But after the couple died in a car accident, the Deetz family moved in and the house modern, city-slicker remodel both inside and out. The house seen in the film, filmed in Vermont, was just a façade that was later demolished; Soundstages were filmed in inner Culver City, California. You can .com before and after the Beetlejuice house in HouseBeautiful, Turkey. We wouldn't be mad if 19 of Green Gables' 23 Mothers told us we should spend the rest of our lives on the set of the 1985 film version of Anne of Green Gables. Shot around Prince Edward Island, Canada, and Southern Ontario, the film united several different locations to create Green Gables, the charming farm where trouble-making orphan Anne Shirley was sent to live. Although not used in the film, you can visit the real Green Gables farm, which inspired author Lucy Maud Montgomery's Anne of Green Gables novels - designated a Canadian National Historic Site in 1985. The stunning locations featured in the 2005 version of 20 of 23 Pride & Prejudice Jane Austen's Pride & Prejudice do not believe, but it is Pemberley, the fictional estate owned by Mr Darcy, who fails without ever attracting our hearts in the countryside. Austen's original inspiration for Pemberley is believed to be Chatsworth House in Derbyshire, England. However, most of the interior shots were shot equally at the beautiful Wilton House in Wiltshire. As a result, if it means living in Pemberley, arrogant or not, we would never have turned down Mr Darcy's marriage proposal. 23 Meet Me in St. Louis Starring Judy Garland,1944's Meet Me in St. Louis is set at the turn of the century- you were predicted— St. Louis, Missouri, and follows the story of the Smith family. Judy's character Esther is reluctant to leave-and I don't blame her: the Smiths live in a drop of dead-awesome Victorian house at Kensington Avenue. In real life, the father of writer Sally Benson (based on his short stories in the film) had bought the house at this address for his family in 1891. (According to an article in Turner Classic Films, this house was demolished in 1994.) The Victorians who appeared in the film were built by MGM, along with the stately houses surrounding it. The set, known as St. Louis Street, has appeared in several films over the years. 22 23 Royal Tenenbaums In Wes Anderson's 2001 film Royal Tenenbaums, eccentric titular family lives equally in an eccentric but beautiful-old building at 111 Archer Avenue in New York City. Although the address is fictional, you can find the building seen in the film at the corner of real-Harlem 144 Street and Convent Avenue. According to Gizmodo, Anderson rented this place for six. And the majority of the interior scenes- as well as the stage on the roof- were shot on the spot, except for those in the kitchen. Anderson wrote in an .com Vulture that the only trick was with their kitchen, which was located in the house next door, because this place had no window. Says. The building is now a private residence. 23 Great Expectation23 Charles Dickens' Great Expectations 1998 film adaptation the novel's original setting is the 19th century film adaptation. Nora aptly lives in Paradiso Perduto (paradise lost), a fragmented and overgrown-but still surprisingly beautiful-garden estate called. Sarasota, Florida's Cà d'Zan stopped as Nora's home for the film-spanning Venice-inspired mansion originally built as the winter home of John Ringling in 1924, fame at Ringling Bros Circus. In the 90s, the house and land had fallen into a state of serious neglect, so The Great Expectations seemed to be in real life exactly what place you saw on the screen. Fortunately, thanks to a six-year renovation that began in 2002, Cà d'Zan has now been fully restored. You can even get married there! It's over there!
