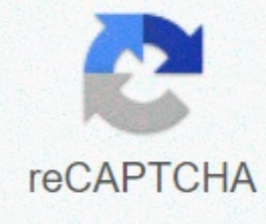

External writing and review will use survey data, focus group data, and other stakeholder feedback from this review to make changes for draft two. The general feedback survey for Draft 2 opened on April 7, 2020 and will close on April 27, 2020. Each course, kindergarten with high school, has its own individual survey. Feedback from these surveys, along with input from teachers and social studies experts from North Carolina Public Schools, is that standards are 3rd. These standards define what students know and can do. Based on a philosophy of teaching and learning consistent with existing research, exemplary practices, and national standards, the Standard Course of Study is designed to support North Carolina educators in providing the most challenging education possible for state students. The aim of these standards is to prepare all students for career and university readiness. With these standards as a foundation, local school leaders make decisions about the comprehensive curriculum they choose to offer students so they can reach content standards for each class and subject. In addition, local schools and districts can offer elective courses and courses above and beyond the content standards of the NC Standard Education Course. Classroom teaching is a partnership between the state that sets content standards in the Standard Education Course and local educators who determine which curriculum materials to use to provide teaching to reach standards.*Note: To access standards, visit the North Carolina Public Schools website, the authorized source of all standards approved by the NC State Board of Education. The Review, Review and Implementation of Standards process ensures that each content area has a comprehensive study based on class level, proficiency level and/or course. The five- to seven-year cycle provides time for a review, review and consistent implementation of standards. Compliance with the statewide evaluation program, expanded content standards and material acceptance will be addressed throughout the process as appropriate.
