I believe you are the victim of a military romance scandal, while the person you are talking to is a foreigner national posing as an American soldier to be stationed overseas on a peacekeeping mission. It's important to claim the scandal they always have to be on a peacekeeping mission. Part of their scandal is saying they have no access to their money that their mission is extremely dangerous. If your beloved girlfriend/future spouse is asking you to do the following or have demonstrated this behavior, this one most likely takes you to the private messaging site immediately after meeting you on a scam: Facebook or SnapChat or Instagram or some dating or social media site. Often times they remove the site you met with them, after which they asked you to go to more private messaging sites and use broken language of their kind to quote poems and song songs, as they quickly profess their love and devotion. They also for your health and love for your family Visible. Marriage as promised As he/she gets to state for vacation they asked to pay for you. They have money (wire transfer) and Amazon, iTune, Verizon, etc. requests for gift cards, medicine, religious practices, and leaves to come home, internet access, full job assignments, help sick friends, get him out of trouble, or anything that seems fishy. Military food provides all soldier needs, including medical care and transportation for leave. Believe me, I lived it, you're probably being scammed. I'm just trying to show you the examples that you most likely connned. Below is an emailed response I received after I sent an investigation to the US government when I found out I was scammed. I found this amazing response that there are a lot of useful links on how to find and report your scammers. And how to learn more about romance scandals. Right now you can also copy the picture he gave you and do a Google image search and you will hopefully see pictures of the real person he is impersonating. It doesn't always work and takes some digging. If you get a real person you can message them directly and alert them that their image is being used for scamming. Good luck to you and I'm sorry it might be happening to you. Please continue reading the government's response I received below is very informative. You have contacted an email that is monitored by the US Army Criminal Investigation Command. Unfortunately, this is a common concern. We can assure you that there is never any reason to send money to anyone claiming to be a soldier online. If you've only spoken online with this person, it's likely they're not an American soldier at all. If this is a dubious hypocritical social media profile, we urge you to report it on that platform as soon as possible. There are a lot of life skills that people need that aren't taught in school. The question is, should those skills be taught in schools? I teach high school, so I will talk about that. The typical high school curriculum is supposed to be a broad-based education for students that prepares them to be citizens in a democracy and be able to think critically. In the case of democracy working, we need educated, sensible citizens with good decision-making ability based on evidence and objective consideration. In theory, those who are well informed about history, culture, science, mathematics, etc., and are capable of important, fair thinking, will be the tools to participate in democracy and to make good decisions for themselves and for society at large. In addition, they should learn how to be learners, how to do effective, do basic research, and collaborate with others. If that happens, it should not provide much challenge to find out how to perform procedural tasks in real life. We can't possibly teach every essential life skills people need, but we can help students become better at knowing what skills they need. Should we teach them how to change a tire when they can easily consult a book or find step-by-step instructions to search the Internet? Should we teach them how to balance a cheque book or teach them how to think mathematically and make sense of problems so that the simple task of balancing a cheque book (which requires simple arithmetic and the ability to enter numbers and words in columns and lines in clear ways) is easy for them to figure out. If we teach them Good at thinking and some problem solving skills they will be able to apply those comprehensive skills to all kinds of each type Tasks that have decent cognitive ability to detect it shouldn't be difficult for anyone. This corresponds to asking why a culinary school hasn't taught its students the ingredients to move and a specific recipe. The school taught them about more general food preparation and food science skills so that they could find out how to make a lot of specific recipes without any hassle. They are also able to make their own recipes. So, do we want citizens with very specific skill sets to need to get into day-to-day life or do we want citizens with critical thinking, problem solving, and other extensive cognitive skills that will allow them to easily acquire any simple, procedural skills that they may need at any point in their lives? I On your airport customs forms, to write on boxes that you "need" - basically invisible to scanners - are used because then we make it easier for humans to identify with a computer which is clean and clear. Any character with accuracy less than X% is flagged based on a recognition engine and shown as a rapidly enhanced image in the particular character so that a human operator can then say it is an A. This way, you can rapidly pass through most forms and output it to say - a SQL database, complete with a link to the original image of the form you filled out. If you see black boxes at three corners of the document - it is likely to be installed for scanning (they help to digitally identify and orient the page). If there is a unique barcode on the document somewhere I would have the principle there is an even greater likelihood of it being scanned - the document is of sufficient value to be printed individually which costs more, which means it is likely to be used on the occupying side. (I've seen in the past in the Bahamas and some other Caribbean people entering the islands they use these kinds of occupying mechanisms, but they do far less everyday than the U.S.) the real answer is: it depends. Based on each country and its policies and procedures. Normally I would be surprised if they scanned and conducted on paper. In the U.S., they file those for a set period, then destroy them, perhaps mining them for some data about travelers. Finally, I suspect paper-to-view data-capture customs forms likely ranges somewhere on a spectrum like this: the Third World Customs man is thrown out to paper to show he has done his job, at the end of the paper shift. -----> We keep all the papers! As everything is scanned Identification passed by customs and unique barcodes which was handed over to the flight/gate/area form, so we coordinate with the cameras in coordination The airport and your image is captured.
