However, creating your own online game server can be easy and can give you more control over your server and freedom than hosting companies. Online game servers can be created for almost any game that can be hosted remotely. Download server hosting software for your game. Save these files to the game folder (usually located in the Program Files section of the drive). Start setting up the server. Use notepad to open the server file .cfg the server software folder. This is the file in which all server settings are configured. Type your computer's IP address in the IP address section of the configuration file server. If you don't know your computer's IP address, open your web browser and go to . Copy and paste the IP address displayed on this site into a file Enter the IP address that is currently in your web browser (i.e.). When the router router window opens, type the page and create a new port. Set the numeric value for this port between 3000 and 4000. Then set the access for this port to full access. Type the port number that you just created in the Port section of the server configuration file. This will allow users to navigate the router and access the game server program. Change other options in the configuration file to the one you want. These include server name, game types, maximum number of players, maximum ping among other options. Start the game server by double-clicking the executable file attached to the server software. Typically, this will be a .exe.
