New center school calendar

iOS: Sunrise for iPhone is more than just a calendar app, it posts important information about your day front and center, including appointments you need to make, friends' birthdays and events, the day's weather, and more. Best of all, it syncs with Google Calendar so you don't have to start over, and use Google Maps for directions to events, automatically assign your time zone and remind you when an event is about to begin. If Sunrise looks familiar, it's because the app was developed by the same people behind the previously mentioned email digest service with the same name. The iOS app takes things up a bit by giving you an app that syncs with Google Calendar in real time, brings in Facebook events, birthdays, and other notifications (including invitations you get through Facebook), and allows you to create new opportunities and invite people right out of the app. The app understands time zones and matches your calendar and warns until the time where you are, even support ordinary language when events are added or editd (so Lunch tomorrow at 11am is entered correctly.) Sunrise is a new web service that sends an email every morning full of important information:... Read moreYou can fuel the Sunrise app to see your daily list of events and appointments, in the same way the email service does, but the app gives you control over the individual appointments and allows you to reschedule them, contact the organizer, even get directions via Google Maps to the event or appointment location. You can see the weather conditions predicted right next to that in your daily view for the event time, and use livestock gestures to move from the daily view to weekly or monthly on a weekly basis. Sunrise is completely free and now available in the iTunes App Store.Update: The team at Sunrise just pushed an update to the app in the iTunes App Store that lets you sign in via Google as opposed to Facebook for those who requested it. Enjoy! Sunrise Calendar (Free) | iTunes App Store via Sunrise Like many Mesoamerican calendars, the Tzolk'in, or Holy Round, calendar operates on a 260-day cycle. One theory for the meaning of its cycle length is that the 260 days correlate with pregnancy [source: Maya Mystery School]. Another suggestion that the calendar represents the length of time to cultivate wheat. However, it's more likely that based on the Mayans' reverence for the numbers 13 and 20. In the Gregorian calendar we have seven days of the week and, depending on the month, anywhere from 28 to 31 days. The Tzolk'in the calendar consists of a set of 20 day names, symbolized by images called glyphs, and 13 numerals called tone. The days are numbered one to 13, and the names are also given in sequence. The beginning of the Tzolk'in calendar with the first day name, Imix', and the number one. The days continue in sequence, with the second day 'a combination of Iq' and the number two; The names and numbers combine in sequence until all 13 colors are used. Once the calendar reaches the day 13, indicated by B'and the number 13, the numbers start again with one, but the day names move forward with the 14th glyph, Ix. By turning this way, the two sets form 260 unique combinations of a day name and a number. For example, once you reach the end of the cycle of day names with 7 Ajaw, the day names start cleaning up at Imix, and the numeral continues: 8 Imix', 9 Ic', 10 Ak'b'al and so on. This content is not compatible on this device. Think of two locking gears, with the 13 numeral spaced around a smaller circular gear that fits inside of the larger gear of day names indicated in hierogies. If you lock those gears together at the number one and the day name Imix', then turn the gears until you reach one again and Imix, you get 260 unique days. Those gears rotate until the final combination clicks into place at 13 Ajaw, marking the end of the year. It's easy to see the significance the Mayans put into the Tzolk'in the calendar. For example, they believed that the date of your birth determines the qualities you will show in your personality - much like some people believe your astrological sign does today. Holy men also schedule certain events throughout the year based on the Tzolk'in calendar. At the beginning of each uinal (period of 20 days), a shaman would count forward to determine when religious and ceremonial events would occur. He would then choose the dates that would be the most prosperous or happiest for the community. Despite its myriad features, the Tzolk'in calendar still couldn't measure a solar year, the time it takes for the sun to make a complete cycle. As a result, the Mayans needed a more accurate calendar to track the time extension we consider a full year.
