



Diaper genie expressions user manual

1 Take an inventory of the pieces that came with your diaper genius[®]. Read the instruction manual that comes with your diaper genius[®] to make sure you understand all parts of the package and how each one works. Before you start the assembly process, make sure that you have all the parts listed in the instruction manual. If something is missing, wait until you get the missing parts. If you find that you are missing parts, call the customer service line in the manual and request that the spare parts be shipped to you. 2 Place the top and bottom on the hinge. The first step in assembling your ® of diapers is to join the top (piece A) and bottom (piece B) of the genius. There is a hinge at the bottom of part A and a bar at the top of part B. While holding down the top at a 45-degree angle, place the B-piece bar on the hinge and press down until they click together. There is no need to force the hinge in place. You just have to push it until you hear a click. 3 Flip the top and click in place. After securing the hinge between the top and bottom of your Diaper Genie®, flip the top over the bottom of the genie and press down until they click together. At this point, your genius should look like a tall, thin cylinder. 4 Prepare a coating refill for ® Genie diaper pack. You will need to place the plastic coating on your genius in order to use it. To add a new recharge tab to remove the plastic seal. Then pull down until you've thrown about 18 inches of film (or enough to fill the bottom of the Genie®). Tie a knot at the bottom of the liner. [1] A hand knot works best to secure the bottom of its lining. [2] 5 Place the coating on the genie. Finally, place your liner filler on top of your diaper ® and push the knot you've tied down through the clamp. Close the lid of your Genie diaper ®. Now you're ready to start using it. [3] 1 Roll the diapers into a tight ball. After changing your baby, roll up his diaper well, securing it with the duct tape in the diaper. It is best to roll the diaper in an oblong shape or a small round package. [4] The tighter you can wrap your dirty diapers, the longer the Diaper Genie will hold before you have to empty it. Do not leave the adhesive tape unsure because this can be attached to the lining of your genius, causing it to break. Generally, ® diapers will have approximately 34 newborn diapers at a time. This number will decrease as your child gets older. [5] 2 dirty diaper. Once you have rolled up your dirty diaper, lift the Genie diaper cover® and insert the diaper. Push the dirty diaper all the way through the clamp. Make sure the clamp closes again after you have inserted the diaper. Once you've done this, close the lid. [6] Once the clamp closes, the ® rotates the film directly clamp, sealing the dirty diaper on top. 3 Remove the top of the cube. Once your diaper ® is full, light up the top from below by pressing the button in the center of the genie (where the top and bottom are located). Flip the top upwards, revealing the cutting mechanism built inside. [7] 4 Cut the liner on top. After unscrewing the top and revealing the child-proof cutter in genius, pull the coating into the cutting mechanism and press down until the coating is cut. Tie a knot, usually three or four inches. 5 Remove the complete coating. Once vou've tied the top of your lining, lift the entire bag and discard the dirty diapers wherever you dispose of your trash outside. 1 Tie a knot in the lining. Once you have removed the entire lining, be sure to tie a knot at the beginning of the new lining. If you don't, the dirty diapers you place on the genie will fall on the bottom of the liner when you're going to remove the next full load. 2 Remove approximately 18 inches of coating. After tying a knot at the end of the lining you just cut, pull about 18 inches of lining, as you did when you were preparing to use your diaper genius® for the first time. Make sure that the amount you extract is sufficient to fill the bottom of the cube. [8] 3 Secure the top back at the bottom. Finally, flip the top of the diaper genius® back so that it is sitting at the bottom of the genie. Press down until the two parts snap back into place. [9] 4 Clean your diaper ® weekly. As you can imagine, you'll have to clean your Genie from diapers® routinely to keep germs and any persistent smells of your child's dirty diapers to a minimum. The best way to do this is to cleanse your genius at least once a week. To do this, disassemble the Genie ® and clean both inside and outside with a bleach-based solution. If you want to be more complete, clean it with an antibacterial wipe several times throughout the week. Also, each time you change the coating on ® diaper box, spray the inside with a disinfectant spray and odor neutralizer. [10] 5 Invest in a deodorizing filter. The Genie ® tool doesn't come with a built-in deodorant, but investing in one is a good way to help reduce the daily smell of your child's dirty diapers. You can find deodorizing carbon filters for your Diaper Genie® in almost retailers in general, such as Walmart or Target. These filters come with a box that joins the lid of your Genie ® and several individual carbon filters. To use, simply unhook the top of the box, place a filter inside and adjust the closed box. Filters should be replaced at least every 90 days for best results. [11] Add new question The lid Deranged. Is there a trick to get it back without breaking it? It is a manual push that will propel the diaper into the bag inside the machine. Question How do you know when it's full? It's full when you can't comfortably fit more diapers into it. Ouestion The clamps crumbled. How do I put it back together? There are two pieces on the cutter. Hold the two pieces so that the cutter and the spring attached and the part on which the spring is located point to each other. Hook the curved end of the part with the cutter under the spring on the other piece. Then flip the part with the spring down, hooking it onto the cutting part track. Once the parts are connected, hold them so that the cutting mechanism points to the ceiling and put them back in place inside your Genie ® diaper system. Watch a video demo. Press the button on the front of your Genie to separate the Genie top rest on the ground. You won't need it for a while.) [1] If any diapers remain at the top of the Genie, push them down at the bottom of the Genie. Be careful to go slowly when opening your Genie. You don't want to make a mess! 2 Cut your bag. Diapers must be consolidated at this point in the Genie diaper and contained in a bag. Grab the bag a few centimeters above where the diapers are stored and give the bag a small shake; this one further consolidate diapers. In the middle of your Genie diaper you'll find the cutter. Use this to cut the bag about six inches above where the diapers hide. The cutter is located in the center of the top of the Genie. You should be able to detect easily, as long as your diaper genius is open. 3 Dispose of your bag. Lift the Genie's whole bag and give it one more smoothie to consolidate diapers. Close the bag by tying a double knot. Dirty diapers are now ready to be discarded in any available trash. [3] Be sure to tie your tightest knot. Otherwise, you run the risk of leaks and odors. Keep your foot on the pedal to prevent your diaper Genie from overturning. [4] 4 Recharge your Genie diaper. Take the bag that's still attached to your diaper genie. Tie a knot at the bottom. Pull the bag to create some slack on top of your diaper genius and place the bag on the bottom of your diaper genius. Close the lid of your diaper genie. [5] Consider putting a small deodorant on the bottom of the bucket if you want to avoid odors. You'll know that the Genie has successfully closed when you hear the top close. You should remove about 18 inches (46 cm) of bag to prepare for the next use. 1 Check the indicator. You will know that your Diaper Genie is ready for a bag reload because the reload film will say almost empty and needs to be replaced. Genie diaper refill cartridges are available for purchase online and in stores. A pack of three Genie diaper cartridges costs about \$15 on Amazon. Each pack consists of 270 bags per cartridge. Check eBay or sales in your area to see if you can buy top-ups near home. 2 Remove the plastic seal. Hold the Diaper Genie cartridge in one hand and use the other to rip the plastic seal on top. Remove the bag from the top of the cartridge, then pull it through the center of the cartridge. Tie a tight knot at the bottom of the bag. You will have to pull about 46 cm of bag to prepare for the next use. If you don't remember to take out enough bag for the next use, don't worry. Just be aware that you'll be able to put fewer diapers in your bag than you're used to. 3 Complete the recharge. Open the Genie diaper cover and remove the old cartridge. Replace it with the new cartridge and thread the bag through the clamp so that the knot hangs on the bottom of the Genie diaper. Put the lid back on your diaper genius; you'll know that the lid has been secured correctly when you hear a click. The clamp is located in the center of the top of the Genie diaper and is used fix the bag in place. After securing the clamp, check that you have tied the bag. There's nothing worse than realizing you forgot to close the bag, after the diapers are already in the bucket. 1 Open your Genius. Depending on whether you have the Diaper Genie or the Elite Diaper Genie, you will do so in one of two ways. To open the Genie diaper, lift the lid from the top. To open the Elite, use your foot to press the pedal at the bottom of the Genie. [6] If you smell a smell coming from your diaper genie, without the Genie opening up, it's time for a clean outing. Try to clean your diaper genius every time you change the bag. Wash your diaper genie with soapy water. Clean it with a bleach-based cleaner and then let it dry in the sun. [7] 2 Discard the diaper. Push the diaper through the Genie diaper clamp until it disappears from view. You will want to make sure that the clamp closes completely; otherwise you run the risk of odors and leaks. To adjust the maximum number of diapers inside your Genie, roll up your diapers well. To prevent the contents of the diaper from spilling during transit, secure the diaper with the diaper's adhesive eyelashes. 3 Close the diaper genius. If you have the Diaper Genie Elite, remove your foot from the pedal to close the can. If you have the original Genie, close the cover manually. If you can't close the Diaper Genie, this means it's too full and it's time to refill the cartridge. If your diaper genie isn't full and isn't closing yet, there may be a diaper obstruction you can't see. Make sure the diaper pieces aren't stuck in the Genie diaper cover.
