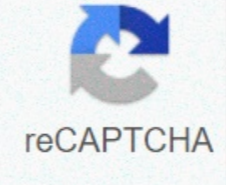

Unauthorized over the wall on foreign websites, ordered to stop the Internet and warned the release time: 2017-03-28 08:38:51 Source: Chongqing Morning Post China Youth Network Yesterday, the municipal government's public information network issued a revised Chongqing Municipal Public Security Bureau network supervision administrative discretionary benchmark. Valid from July 27, 2016 to July 26, 2021. Any person who intentionally enters computer viruses or malicious data and breaks the law for the first time and does not actually compromise the security of the computer system shall receive a warning. If the illegal income of an individual is more than 5000 yuan and the illegal income of the unit is more than 15,000 yuan, and the criminal penalty is not sufficient, the illegal income shall be confiscated and a fine of 2 to 3 times the illegal income shall be imposed; Help over the wall on the internet to make money up to 15,000 illegal acts: unauthorized establishment, use of illegal channels for international networks; Penalties: Not for profit, the first implementation of the above violations, ordered to stop networks, give a warning. If the illegal act is committed for profit, the illegal income shall be ordered to stop networks, give a warning and confiscate the illegal income; if the illegal income for profit is committed for profit, the illegal income shall be ordered to stop the network, give a warning, impose a fine of no less than 5000 yuan and less than 10,000 yuan on the unit, and confiscate the illegal income for profit; If the illegal income is more than 10,000 yuan or ordered to stop connecting to the Internet and continue to commit the illegal act, it shall be ordered to stop the Internet, shall be given a warning, and shall be fined between 10,000 yuan and 15,000 yuan, and the illegal proceeds shall be confiscated. Open Internet cafes do not register identity cards up to 5000 yuan penalty of illegal acts: to provide the Internet consumers with direct access to the Internet computer; The Internet Service business unit has not handled any illegal acts such as changing registration cases, terminating business procedures and filing by law. Penalties: If the initial implementation has not yet caused harmful consequences or social impact, a warning shall be given and a fine of no more than 5000 yuan shall be imposed. Topics ranged from speed and cost to mobile Internet growth and how technology will change in the future. Here are the excerpts: Q 1) How would you rate the internet experience here compared to your country? Internet mobile has grown exponentially in China recently. Is the situation similar in your country? Q 2) People in China use the Internet for almost all services, such as booking taxis, shopping, paying bills. Do you also see such extensive use in your country? Q 3) Cybersecurity is a big issue both in China and around the world. Are you satisfied with the steps your government has taken to address cyber threats? Q 4) There's a lot of talk about super fast high speed internet, rolling out of IPv6 and tablets replacing TV. What are some of the major developments you expect in the near future? Pernille Paulsen, who comes from Denmark, is a student who has lived in Beijing for 3 years. A1: Like most expats living in China I subscribe to a VPN service that is overall stable and allows me to access all the websites I usually use at home, such as Facebook and various news sources. The situation of Internet mobile is nowhere near as to the same extent as in China. A2: The use of Internet services has been increasing for a while, but unlike in China, it is not so common in Denmark to use mobile Internet services A3: I believe that the Danish Government takes the cybersecurity challenge very seriously and actively seeks to identify and apply the necessary measures to combat cybercrime. A4: The Internet will continue to have a more dominant role on the average person's lives, especially mobile Internet as it caters to the convenience and time-saving needs of people. Everything can be done on the go. When it comes to TV, the internet allows me to stream and download news and TV shows that I can watch when it's convenient for me. I almost never watch traditional TV Longer. Clare Buchanan, who comes from the UK, is a web editor who has lived in Beijing for a year. A1: So far I've found the Internet here better. My experience has been that the adjustment process was extremely straight forward, fast and efficient. In the UK it is not uncommon to be forced to wait two weeks or more to get the Internet installed, not to mention this usually comes at a hefty cost and at a set time that can be inconvenient. The quality/speed seems to be about the same to me. It seems, as in China, in the UK you can now do pretty much everything you would do on your computer via mobile Internet and it is rare to find anyone, or stores selling, phones that do not have/activate Internet features. Even simple messaging services most people now use mainly Internet based, rather than the old text style. A2: Yes. It is now frustrating, although very rare, to come across a service that you can't do/use on the Internet as it has become so widespread and is much easier and faster. A3: To be perfectly honest I don't know what, if any, steps the government has taken to deal with the threats! I should probably be more aware of cybersecurity, but right now the attitude is that hopefully it won't happen to me. Maybe I'll look into it a little more! A4: I think I would expect all of the above and generally a more all-round, connected up the use of the Internet, at the beginning of which we are already seeing. For example, the apps or devices that allow you to control things at home, such as opening your windows or turning on the oven, from your mobile device while you're out walking. I expect this type of Internet technology to be used for pretty much every aspect of our lives and I'm sure these features and many more will be concentrated on more portable devices that seamlessly link. I believe that with the increasing interest in health, fitness and well-being there will also be exciting developments in the use of the Internet in that area, again as we have begun to see with basic activity trackers.
