Even though it was yesterday, but better late than never right? It is quite well known that there are numerous VOCALOID songs that are on the darker side. Granted, not all vowel songs are happy. One of my favorites among their dark songs is the ever-famous Dark Woods Circus, which is the third part of the dark series of Machigeriita-P's tune. The story of his series is pretty deep, so expect a massive nosebleed – this entry might shed light on the story behind the Dark Woods Circus. The DWC is basically the aftermath, when Miku, along with other vocaids, was captured and forcibly deformed so that they could be given to the circus. The song has mixed emotions from circus performers, both their happy and grieving sides. Even though the series runs from Miku's point of view. Now the DWC is actually based on REALITY Yes, it means that the song reflected an event in history where people were forcibly deformed and thrown into the circus to become an attraction. Creepy, isn't it? But the era in which the DWC is based is in japan's Edo era. Back then, the main target for circus performers was usually young children, who they often abduct. Frankly, people are interested in freaks or something that looks unusual, and usually there aren't just performers in the circus, but we can't deny that some have the main attractions. What makes the song and its story a little darker is that these people who run the circus kidnap children and MAKE THEM DEFORMED. Len & Rin - Two heads and one body They were twins who were deformed Siamese twins. Usually in the old days, Siamese twins were one of the biggest attractions of circuses. Mainly because they've joined their bodies. Miku - Deformed diva She was deformed as part of the animal, which explains her goat leg. In addition, he also became the main attraction by singing songs to the audience. Search & Neru - The two were not officially given titles, but they filmed circus members with anomalies in height. This explains why both are strangely tall in the video. Meiko - There is a debate about whether Meiko is a child or a woman in a red dress, but let's just say she's a child. Make-up represents the innocence and curiosity of young children whenever they see a circus. He also represents how it was easy to kidnap and vulnerable children when they were deceived by circus performers. I hope you enjoy the secrets of the song. The romance between Aisaka and Ryuji has developed over a long period of time until both come to the conclusion that they cannot be without each other. Each of them sacrifices the things they're looking for to be after each other for crucial moments. Relationships are tested as characters go through changes in their lives. I'm looking for their place in this world. A perfect example of this is Yusaku, the vice president starting to go about the rebellion phase of the 1990s. She died of her hair, ran away from home and left the student council. Any wrong move The relationship between him and Ryuji could easily have broken down and disintegrated. Through patience, carefully crafted conversations and a fake campaign. Ryuuji manages to help his friend find his place, find out what he wants to do for himself and where he intends to go forward. This is just one example of the fact that anime has much more heartfelt and authentic moments that lead to important character changes. Things aren't always that easy, sometimes relationships and friendships fall apart to the point where the characters physically fight each other. What makes these moments even more satisfying is slow accumulation, tensions escalate, bullying turns into insults. It shows the true power of slow and subtle accumulation. It's always a good sign when anime visually tells things about the character instead of just explaining things to you.
