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Swimming diversity camp

Each spring, U.S. Swimming invites 48 athletes from underrepresented residents to participate in a three-day camp program that includes pool training, motivational and educational sessions and team building events. The selection is based on the time swum of U.S. Swimming sanctioned events. Instill a vision of success and inspire athletes from ethnically underrepresented populations to become leaders in sports swimming. Goals: Empower athletes from ethnically underrepresented populations and their coaches: Demonstrate the viability of multicultural success in swimming. Achieve performance excellence at all levels of sport. Express the advantages and value of participating in sports swimming. Help recruit more swimmers and coaches from different nationalities to make sports swimming. Be positive leaders and sample samples that others of multicultural origin can emulate. SITE: U.S. Olympic Training Center (OTC), Colorado Springs, CO Dates: December 17-20, 2020. Athletes will arrive on Thursday and depart Sunday morning. NUMBER OF ATHLETES: 48 athletes (24 boys and 24 girls) Application deadline: Application is now closed. AGE: 14 – 16 years. Age is from the first day of camp May 7, 2020. These populations may include: African American, Hispanic, Asian or Pacific Islander, Native American and others. As an additional component, six athletes of each gender will be selected from Outreach membership applicants. The swimmer cannot visit Zone Select Camp and Variety Select Camp in the same year. QUALIFICATION STANDARDS: Athletes must have achieved at least one choice of diversity Choose camp time standard, as shown here to apply for selection. These times are at the AAAA National Motivationl Times 13-14 years old. Times must reach U.S. Swimming sanctioned or approved matches (can be proven in the SWIMS database). Application: The application is now closed. Please note: The application must be completed by the athlete. The athlete must have a US Swimming website account and a username that is associated with the athlete's US Swimming record. The athlete will not be able to access the application until you log in to his or her account. SELECTION CRITERIA: The athlete with the fastest time in each of the 13 Olympic tournaments will be automatically selected from the applications. LCM times only Considered. In addition, three athletes of each gender will be selected based on IMX scores, three athletes of each gender will be selected based on outstanding performance at one or more events, and five athletes of each gender will be selected based on Outreach membership status. CAMP SCHEDULE: The 3-day camp program will include combining billiard training, motivational and educational sessions, as well as team building activities. COST: Every athlete selected for the camp will be given free space and board at the Olympic Training Center, ground transportation in Colorado Springs and full airfare to Colorado Springs. PERSONAL COACHES: As with the National Select Camp program, personal trainers from athletes selected will be invited to attend the camp and will be given an educational tract similar to that offered to athletes. Personal trainers will be provided room and board at the OTC, ground transportation from/to Colorado Springs airport, and \$200 compensation to compensate for airfare expense. CAMP STAFF: Camp staff will be selected from accomplished multicultural candidates from across the U.S. and include a head coach, four assistant coaches, two managers, and a national team athlete. Candidates for trainers and assistants must submit a written application. Employees will be notified when the team is set, however the appointment depends on passing all the necessary background screens. Staff applications are now closed. U.S. swimming staff: Sports development and national team department staff, as well as external speakers, will be assigned as needed to provide support and presentations. NOTICE OF INCLUSION: The U.S. Center for Safe Sports and U.S. Safe Sports prohibits discrimination against any member or participant on grounds of gender, sexual orientation, sexual desire, and gender identity (paragraph 304.3.3). The selected athletes, representing 42 clubs from 22 countries, will receive airfare, room and board to attend the National Diversity Select Camp from May 7-10 at the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Personal coaches of selected athletes are also invited to attend the camp and will have educational opportunities on their own. Coaches are provided space and board at the OTC, as well as \$200 compensation to compensate for airfare billing. Under USA Swimming: The goal of the camp is to vision of success and inspire athletes from ethnically underrepresented populations to become leaders in sports swimming. The National Diversity Select Camp brings together some of U.S. Swimming's most diverse talents for extended weekend pool training, leadership development, team building activities and training. Athletes' personal trainers are invited to attend the camp as well. The United States Swimming National Diversity Select Camp aims to: Demonstrate the viability of multicultural success in swimming Achieve performance excellence at all levels of sports Expound benefits and value participating in sports swimming to help recruit more swimmers and coaches from different nationalities to sports swimming Be positive leaders and role models that others from multicultural backgrounds can emulate. Among the program's alumni includes 4-time Olympic medalist Simone Manuel and 2019 U.S. National Team members Jack Levant and Daniel Roy. 2004 Olympic silver medalist Maritza McClendon (Correia), who was the first black American to set an American and world record for swimming, will attend the camp as well as mentor young athletes. She is one of 8 staff representing clubs across the country who will run the camp. It's powerful for these athletes to connect with other swimmers who are navigating our sport in the way they can relate to, said Mariejo Truex, senior director of Education and Programs at USA Swimming. For some it is the first time they are able to see and interact with other swimmers who look like them or can identify with their experiences. This camp helps build leadership skills and lead performance, knowing that these athletes are not the only ones and knowing that they need support not only from other athletes, but from coaches, officials, parents, volunteers and U.S. swimming staff. Athletes must apply for the program and have reached the National Diversity Select Camp qualifying time (equivalent to AAAA times for 13-14 year olds). Among the applications received, swimmers were automatically selected with the fastest time in each of the 13 individual Olympiads (only long course times). Another 3 athletes of each gender were selected based on IMX scores, a further 3 of each gender will be selected based on outstanding performance at one or more events, and 5 athletes of each gender will be selected from the U.S. Swimming's Outreach membership pool of athletes who receive a reduced fee for U.S. Swimming membership based on their family's financial situation. There are 6 teams representing several athletes on the roster. Multi-site mega-club NCAP in Washington D.C will send Jennifer Luong and Josh Wolfson to the camp. Another national powerhouse club SwimMAC Carolina will send Hanani Dona and Troy Dienvidrietumu zvaigznes Ziemas dārzš. Florida sūta Nicholas Cecchi un Brennan Muramatsu.
