For students to achieve high standards, art programs must maintain a substantive focus by choosing art content that includes complex problem-solving skills and higher-order reasoning, and serious alignment of curriculum, instruction, evaluation, and professional development that results in student learning. Students are invited to participate based on artistic excellence, work ethic, reliability and character. Membership in the National Honor Society is an honor awarded to students deserving of the faculty of visual arts and will be based on the criteria of scholarship, service, leadership and character. NaHS eligibilityTo be eligible for selection to participate in a naHS chapter of Queen Anne County, the applicant must be a high school student, from 10th to 12th grade, who completed a period equivalent to a semester of art at the school. A transfer applicant must be present for a period of at least one semester in high school as well. It must demonstrate the qualities of the scholarship, leadership, character and service measured by school classification sheets based on a points system developed by the Sponsor of the National Chapter of high school. Each member must maintain an average of 3.0 in all Art classes. Members can remain active during this period when there is no art in their class hours. The elderly earn their honor strings for graduation by completing a senior project. Each student must have had at least two recommendations from the art college. Selected students will receive an invitation to join NAHS at an official induction reception.
