Similarly, if you want to trace a phone number from England, there are many resources available for a small monthly fee. Finding a number from England has never been so streamlined. Make sure you have the specific information needed to conduct your search. The name of the person or business, even a location, will help. Search for a person's or business's phone number through a UK online phone book, such as the BT phone book. The UK electoral roll is a paid service, but the fee allows access to contact details for all UK voters. To find the owner of an England mobile phone number, visit a free online list of mobile phones, such as MobilePhoneNumber.com.
