Their job is to secure every wheel of a vehicle to your axis to allow your car to drive and keep you safe. Understanding how different luggage nut sizes and types can vary from vehicle to vehicle is extraordinary to be able to replace one when it is lost or damaged. Lug NutsThere types are actually a variety of different luggage nuts and l (aka: acorn luggage nuts) are by far the most common type of luggage nut. Seat tapers into the (usually) 60 degree angle. Of all the different types of luggage nuts, the bed-sitting ones are probably the most frustrating and difficult to work with. The problem is that their placement center can be very tricky since they have a small barrel that goes into the luggage. If not quite concentrated, the stem can catch so it looks like the luggage nut has been tightened when it's not actually Because the flat surface has a greater level than others, they are more susceptible to clamping and can be much harder to remove .#4 – Wide ThreadSimilar to standard tapered luggage nut, extensive thread (ET) luggage nut adding longer yarn gains. This is useful in cases where the length of wheel studs and wheel surface mounting simply does not allow enough thread interaction when using regular luggage nuts. Longer thread length allows for better interaction to keep the wheel safer connected.#5 – Mag SeatThis is another type of extensive thread luggage, this time with a wesher seat. It is used in similar situations where longer yarn is required, but instead of conical, the bottom of the strip has a flat chair (sometimes with a washer, sometimes without). They are called mag seat luggage nuts because at one time they are made of magnesium.#6 – StyleMany tuner is a variety of post-market wheels, especially for Hondas, Acuras, and other Asian tuner cars, with smaller diameter holes designed for luggage nuts. Standard acorn lugs will not fit up to the narrower tuner-style luggage nuts required that It's right on it. The natural socket then goes on top of the set key just like any other luggage nut. This key is included when you buy a set of luggage tuner nuts but can also be purchased separately if the key is lost or your car has come with one. Because toosheh-style tuner nuts are open in the center (to accept the key set), air and humidity can lead to studs and yarns and cause corrosion. Because of this, toosheh-style tuner nuts are usually no longer used and spline drive style (below) replaces much better.#7 - Spline DriveLike Tuner Style Luggage Nuts, this unique, small diameter luggage has a tapered seat and uses a special key. The difference is that instead of opening in the middle, The Luggage Drive Spline nuts have narrow grooves on top and luggage nut sides to accept the low profile key. They do not have the same problem with possible corrosion. Keep in mind that the pattern in the spline drive (and tuner style) luggage nuts is not unique so don't assume that you can use either as a robbery deterrent. The corresponding alternative keys can easily be purchased by anyone in the form of local auto parts stores or online.#8 - Lug BoltUsed is mainly connected in German vehicles such as BMW, Mercedes, Audi, and Folk Wagon, these luggage nuts with stud/screws. They brake directly through the rotor cap and into the yarn hub. No one really knows why the Germans use bolts instead of lugs but it may be that it's cheaper than having to press studs to assemble rotors during production or simply that it's easier to replace broken luggage screws instead of studs. Whatever the reason, it makes installing wheels on studs while you put in luggage nuts. You should instead first make sure to pierce the line rotor plate with holes in the hub, then lift the wheel assembly and keep it in place while you install the first couple luggage bolts. There are techniques you can use to make it easier to work but no matter what, the process is more frustrating than using luggage nuts. The short answer is no. A common mistake the car owner can make is to assume all the luggage nuts are the same. As with any other type of fastener, luggage nuts (or luggage screws) have some variation that is often preferred by one manufacturer or another. So, your vehicle plays its part where your luggage nuts are installed. Is the all-size-fits-all nuts the same? This is perhaps the biggest misconception outside of all luggage nuts having the same shape. There are actually several different sizes and cotton fields. Getting this wrong can damage the wheel, as you will use the wrong type of seat. What about this earth thing?
