Braun, HonPSA, PPSA· The PSA Youth Showcase aims to involve the Society and its chapters, clubs, advice and associations in promoting and educating young people in photography, highlighting outstanding photographs of high school-age students. The Youth Showcase is open to all students between the ages of 14 and 19 worldwide and to high school or equivalent. Showcase is an excellent opportunity for eligible students to share their work across all borders and receive recognition for their efforts. Competition opens: October 1, 2020 Entry deadline: SponsorshipAll PSA chapters, PSA-member camera clubs, and PSA member councils and associations are encouraged to serve as sponsors of the Youth Showcase. There are no limits on the number of high schools that are sponsored by the PSA organization, but two participating PSA groups do not sponsor separate entries from the same high school. ParticipationThe Youth Showcase is open to all students between the ages of 14 and 19 worldwide and to high school or equivalent participants. All PSA support organisations (PSA chapters, PSA member clubs, and PSA member camera club councils and associations) participate in selected photographs of high school students invited to submit entries. Only entries submitted by designated representatives of individual PSA sponsors will be accepted. Each school can only sponsor one PSA. Youth Showcase Entry Form is submitted to scheduled entries before uploading the projected entries, it is best to store a copy of the images to be submitted to a folder, preferably on your computer's main drive. 1. Fill in the projected input form by clicking on the projected entry form (PDF). Print the completed entry form and obtain appropriate signatures for reproduction, and the image is the student's work, as shown on the entry form. (Warning: On the signed projected entry form, the student gives PSA permission to reproduce the image for exhibition at the PSA conference, for display on the Showcase CD, and for publication in the PSA Journal and on the PSA website. The student's parent or guardian must also sign the application form if the student is under the age of 18. The student also attests that all elements of the image are the student's work.) 2. A PSA sponsor representative must also fill out the fill-in entry form for each scheduled entry, print out each form, have each entry form signed, and send the completed and signed entry form to the Showcase Director at 300 Lake Shore Road, Grafton, WI 53024 --- OR --- by scanning the completed and signed entry forms and emailing them to the Youth Showcase Director . PSA Scholarship Program awards scholarships to promising college or university students who pursing degrees in photography from the University of Central Oklahoma. Youth Showcase DirectorKathleen Braun PSA Greenhood Scholarship Program Director Sharon Prislipsky PSA strives to encourage the latest generations to learn and share the enjoyment of photography, and is committed to the lives of school-age children and young people around the world by introducing them to photography as a means of self-expression and personal growth. Society has experienced the positive role that photography has played in the world and actively contribute to supporting youth-oriented photography exhibitions and scholarships for photo studies. In 1998, the first Outstanding Photographs of Young Photographers exhibition was selected and shown at the PSA's annual conference in Orlando, Florida. The exhibition will show 55 prints selected from 200 entries from 35 secondary schools in six states supported by eight PSA chapters and PSA member clubs and councils. This was the beginning and the PSA Youth Showcase continues to grow. The first PSA scholarship was awarded in 1954. In 1957, PSA collaborated with the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT) to award PSA-RIT scholarships to students of RIT photography. In 1972, psa formed a similar relationship with the Art Center College of Design (Pasadena, CA) to award scholarships to students who had completed their senior year. In 1977, psa collaborated with the Brooks Institute in Santa Barbara, CA, to help students at the institute continue their studies. The current PSA Greenhood Scholarships (awarded to sophomore students with majors in photography at a school that offers a degree in photography) were first awarded in 2009. The PSA Scholarships and Grants Commission is working with the Education Foundation of the Education Management Corporation (EDMC), which oversees the scholarship process at more than twenty Art Institutes photography programs in the U.S. and Canada, to identify the PSA Scholarship Program recipients. The Wisconsin chapter has sponsored the Milwaukee High Schools Youth Photography Showcase since 1995. It began with the vision and leadership of Audrienne Eder, who provided space for the exhibition at the Milwaukee Art Museum.It to continue its annual event for Milwaukee area high school students in Life in My City and Beyond as the annual theme. The annual awards ceremonies have been well received for good representation at public and private schools in Milwaukee.Photos have been matte and judged by PSA members and for the past 15 years have been displayed at milwaukee town hall rotunda. This is all the result of many dedicated volunteers who devote their time and efforts to the event.
