Once you find out you are pregnant, there will be plenty of new social situations to deal with what you have never experienced before. The first one you're going to face? Knowing when (and how) you also tell friends and family that you are pregnant. It's ok to share the news with family and friends whenever you want, says Marjorie Brody, author of Professional Impressions: Etiquette for Everyone, Every Day. Although some people wait until after the first trimester - when there is less risk of miscarriage - you don't have to keep the news a secret if you don't want to. However, there are some benefits to staying calm for a while. One disadvantage of telling everyone early is that they'll be asking. How do you feel? for months, and you can grow tired of responding, Brody says. Holding on a little can also save you some unnecessary worry. Because older relatives are from generations where things went wrong more often than happens now, they may be very anxious about their pregnancy, says Dana May Casperson, author of Power Etiquette: What You Don't Know Can Kill Your Career. As for coworkers and bosses, wait as long as possible. Stay on until the end of your first quarter - even more so if you're not showing it or if the news could interfere with a promotion, says Judith Bowman, founder of Protocol Consultants International, an etiquette-enrichment training company. Then, privately, tell your boss. Reassure her that you will continue to work for as long as possible and that you plan to return after the baby is born. As your boss may want to discuss the matters immediately, make sure you have researched the company's maternity policy in advance. We ask our etiquette experts to weigh in on stickier pregnancy situations to help you over the next nine months. In a word, delicately. Call or get together, and say softly, Sarah, I'm pregnant. You're one of my best friends, so I wanted to tell you, suggests Brody. And while you don't need to apologize, it's wise to restrict your exuberance. I would try not to overreay with regular updates, Casperson says. Either way, don't make a fertility-challenged friend the last in your social circle to know you're waiting. It will kill friendship if it gets secondhand information, casperson warns. In fact, try to tell you in advance known so you will have time to digest the news. If you bluntly tell the person that she doesn't want her to suffer her belly, she is likely to feel ashamed or hurt, Casperson says. Your best bet: Grind and endure. One last option: Tell your spouse, best friend or coworker that you're close that you'd rather people don't touch your stomach, and ask that he or she tactically spread the word. However, stating that this will only antagonize relatives if they feel passionately you should follow the family's naming tradition. Instead of causing an argument, simply say that you haven't decided on a name yet. Announce your selection only after the baby is born. Although the decision is entirely up to you, you could try something with the same initials or use other family names. Or compromise making Cornelius the middle name. It can be so easy to post a quick jab with something like, Well, I'm pregnant – so there! But hold your tongue and avoid making those statements.
