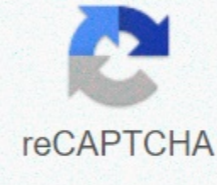

It was serialed from February 1972 to March 1973 in the weekly Playboy Magazine. The series revolves around the title character, a female killer who seeks revenge on bandits who raped her mother and murdered both her parents and older brother, often using her sexual charm to distract her enemies. Lady Snowblad was translated into English and published in four volumes by Dark Horse Comics between 2005 and 2006. The menga was adapted in 1973 with Miko Kaji in a live-action film of the same name. Then Lady Snowblad 2: Love Song of Revenge in 1974. In 2001, the menga was reimaged as the sci-fi action film Blade Princess, played by Yomiko Shaku and Hideaki Ito. The title of japanese title Shurayuki-hime is a pun on the Japanese name Snow White (白雪姫, Shirayuki-hime, Snow White Prince). The word Shura comes in the sense of Asura, the semi-divine consumed in the act of insolent violence and conflict, and the illusion of those living forever involving such a fate. The title was translated as Lady Snowblad because Asura is associated with the term Shura with great battle scene or scene of carnage. [1] Plot Oyuki - Lady Snowblood - is given the task of revenge for killing those who murdered her family and raped her mother. Tokichi Shuey was stabbed to death by Oyuki's mother. Oyuki's mother was sent to prison for the same crime and had a daughter in prison to qesas for exactly three other perpetrators. Okono Keitama was set up by Oyuki to lose all his assets and was framed as the killer. Gichiro Tsukamutou discovered the Oyuki map and used Mayanara as bait but was still killed by Oyuki. Hanzo Tuck Mora begs him for forgiveness, yet he is still being assassinated by Oyuki for honorable retribution. Matsumon-Sen is the leader of a beggar group that helps Oyuki discover the location of his kill list in front of Oyuki stealing a Hojicho for him. [2] Chapters by Playboy Zukan were collected and published in two volumes on December 10, 1972 and March 15, 1973. [2] Since then, the Menga has been reprinted in various editions by various publishers, including a 1976–1977 three-volume version by Akita Schuten, a 1985 five-volume version by Theshbo, and a two-volume version in 2001 by Kadukawa.Schuten. [2] Lady Snowblood: Resurrection Chapter (修羅雪姫 復活之章, Shurayuki-hime: Fukkatsu no Sho) was serialized in Weekly Playboy from November 1973 to June 1974. [3] Lady Snowblad was translated and published in English between 2005 and 2006 by Dark Horse Comics as a collection of four volumes. There are separate parts within each volume, and although each part is usually a self-held arc, it is also a continuation of the larger story.
