

He felt deeply and was broken in a way that very few could see or even know, his father said. Amani quickly learned English and became an American through the right moment, said his father, who is a senior pastor at the Redeemer Lutheran Church in Roxbury. Along the way, his occasional language mistakes always brought a smile: A cold day can be frisky; Lazy Susan was spinning Mary. He played football for West Morris Central High School, and was scheduled to attend James Madison University in the fall. Amani dreamed of a career with the FBI or cia. His proudest moment came in February, when he underwent basic training as a military policeman in the Army Reserves, his father said. Bright and gifted athletically, Amani cherished time with his friends and was looked up and admired by two younger siblings, his father said. Although life with Amani was often challenging, we loved him very much. His departure from us and from this world is an unspeakable tragedy for all of us. He will be a part of our family forever, and we believe he is safe in the arms of Jesus, said Tom Kildea. This story has been updated with information from California, Texas and New York. Amani Kildea, 20, whose body was found hanging in Lewis Morris Park over the weekend, was remembered this week as a beautiful young and old, admired and loved him. He doubted it, but we knew it was true, his father, the Rev. Tom Kildea, said in an online tribute. Kildea said Amani took his own life. Amani Kildea was black. Morris County prosecutors confirmed his suicide findings in a statement Wednesday aimed at curbing public speculation, amid national concerns that hanging black or Hispanic men in California, Texas and New York could signal white supremacist resistance to the Black Lives Matter movement. The deaths were said to be suicides. After morris county spokesman The bureau initially declined to comment on the deaths of a washington township resident, except that the matter was actively investigated by county authorities, prosecutor Fredric Knapp followed up with a brief statement: The Morris County Prosecutor's Office usually does not issue a public statement about an active investigation. Unlike statements made on social media and elsewhere, the investigation remains open and not over, prosecutor Frederic Knapp said. Born in Ethiopia, Kildea was adopted at the age of 5 by Tom and Janice Kildea, senior pastor of the Redeemer Lutheran Church in Succasunna and his wife. He was happiest with a friend and a ball, according to his obituary, and enjoyed basketball and football. Kildea underwent basic military police training in the United States Army Reserve in February. Kildea planned to attend James Madison University -- Tom Kilde's alma mater -- in the fall, hoping to join the FBI or CIA. At 2:47 p.m.m. on June 28, Morris County Park police responded to the Sugarloaf section of the park, according to Lt. Chris List. A visitor to the park called the police and reported the body. Knapp said his Wednesday release of morris county medical examiner's findings regarding Kildea's death was to ensure transparency. Knapp said On Wednesday there was no reason to suggest criminality in Kilde's death. No evidence of a crime has yet been following, and we're continuing to follow all the investigative leads, and we're going to go where the evidence leads us. As the investigation is officials say they can't release too many details for fear of jeopardizing the investigation. Amani was sensitive, gentle, and kind, says his obituary. He was a great listener and loved listening to family stories. He felt deeply, closely watched. It was broken in a way few could see or know. Kildea is survived by his parents, siblings James and Jennifer, Pop-Pop's James Muller, and biological mother Genet in Ethiopia, as well as many other relatives. The service will take place at 7 .m. Monday at the Redeemer Lutheran Church, where Tom Kildea has been senior pastor for nearly 20 years.
