The exam focuses on four areas of practice: safe and effective care Promoting and maintaining health, psychological and social safety, and physiological integrity. The recent practice arena, which tests the ability of applicants to provide appropriate nursing care, usually constitutes 43-67% of NCLEX-RN questions. The Nurses' Licensing Agreement (NLC) allows licensed nurses from Member States to exercise the profession within their mandate. To date, The NLC considers 32 states as full members, with many countries awaiting implementation.
