Percentage of fresno high school students in free and reduced attendance (87.5%) is significantly higher than the state average of 55.7%. This may indicate that the area has a higher poverty level than the state average. Students at a participating school can buy a meal through the National School Lunch Program. Families with incomes of between 130% and 185% of the federal poverty level are eligible for cut-price meals. Schools cannot charge more than 40c for reduced-price lunches, or more than 30c for reduced-price breakfasts. Students from families with incomes equal to or less than 130% of the federal poverty level can enjoy free meals. For 2014, a family of two needs to make an annual income below \$20,449 to be eligible for free meals or below \$29,100 for cut-price meals. A family of four needs to make an annual income below \$31,005 free meals or \$44,122 for reduced-price meals.
