Westminster is one of the few private schools to have managed to raise more than \$100 million as part of a capital campaign; The school has the largest boarding school in the country. More than 1,800 students enroll in Westminster schools on its 180-acre campus. Approximately 26% of students represent people of color, and 15% of students receive needs-based financial support. Westminster Schools has long pioneered private schools in the south-east, hosting a pilot programme for postgraduate studies, which eventually became advanced placement or AP coursework offered by the Higher Education Board, and was also one of the first schools in the South to integrate in the 1960s. According to its bulletin, Westminster Schools launched a capital campaign in October 2006 and completed it in January 2011 after raising \$101.4 million in the midst of the recession. Tomorrow's Teaching campaign was an attempt to secure the best teachers for the school in the years to come. More than 8,300 donors participated in the capital campaign, including current and previous parents, alumni/ae, grandparents, friends and local and national foundations. School President Bill Clarkson praised the school's focus on teaching because it succeeded in raising funds. He believed that the campaign's emphasis on teaching excellence made it possible to raise campaign funds even in difficult economic times. According to an article in the Atlanta Business Chronicle, \$31.6 million to build a new secondary school, \$8 million to continue the school's commitment to diversity, \$2.3 million to promote global awareness, \$10 million to community service programs, \$18.8 million to promote annual giving, and \$9.3 million to unlimited donation funding. The school's current strategic plan calls for a greater focus on globalisation, including teaching its students to thrive in an interconnected world; technology, including teaching students to understand how to deal with the increasing complexity of technology; and educational research and completing studies to determine whether the school's current assessment methods actually help students learn. With the school's 60th anniversary, the success of its capital campaign will help it achieve its strategic goals.
