Queen and Freddie Mercury may be bigger right now than they ever were. The biographical Bohemian Rhapsody introduced a new generation to its classic songs. Unfortunately, Mercury is not alive to take in this cultural moment. But Queen still has to go with a new vocalist: Adam Lambert. Many Queen fans like Lambert as a singer. distasteful. Ultimately, May says Mercury would have approved of Lambert's current role in Queen. May also said that Lambert is the reason queen is able to continue chugging along as a band these days. Freddie Mercury | Graham Wiltshire/Getty Images A statement on Mercury's website reads: For the first time ever, after four decades buried deep in the vaults, a previously unreleased version of Time, recorded in 1986 by Freddie Mercury for the concept album of the hit musical of the same name, has finally appeared after two years of work by the globally successful musician, songwriter and producer Dave Clark, a longtime friend of Freddie, using the song's full title, Time Waits For No One. The track is set for release via Virgin EMI (Universal Music Group) TODAY, June 21, 2019, along with a powerful and deeply moving new movie video. So why was this hidden gem under wraps have it so long? Recorded after Live Aid After Queen's iconic performance on Live Aid in 1985, Mercury's close friend Dave Clark asked Mercury to record some songs. Clark described the day he heard Mercury sing the track Time Waits for No One (formerly called Time). Before any musicians came in, it was just Freddie and [session musician Mike Moran playing] the piano. He sang, and it gave me goosebumps. No one was there. It was just amazing. I can't even explain it, Clark said according to Yahoo. Clark met Mercury after a Queen concert About 10 years before working on Time together, Clark met mercury after one of Queen's first major concerts in 1976. I was standing in the wings, Clark said, as reported by Yahoo. He came on in a leotard with black nail polish and I thought, 'What is this? Liza Minnelli?' Then he opened his mouth and sang, and I said, Wow. He was incredible, just unbelievable. An incredible performer. Then, after the show, we all went with Elton [John] to Mr. Chow's, which was a big restaurant in London. We were just friends. And that was it. As the friendship developed, Clark managed to convince Mercury to work with him on some songs, although Clark was warned by many in the music industry that Mercury was difficult to handle. It was amazing, because everyone said he'd be a nightmare to work with. I am very focused on what I want to do and it must be right; Freddie's the same. The amazing thing was, I didn't agree with certain things, and he gave into it, Clark said, according to Yahoo. He came up with things that I wasn't sure about, but we worked to make the best possible record. There were never any arguments or anything like that. He was amazing. It worked. ... The friendship really developed then. Why drop the song now? Clark remained close friends with Mercury until Mercury's death in 1991 from AIDS. I saw him right at the end, Clark said, as reported by Yahoo. I don't want to get into [talking about] the end, because I think we're talking about Freddie when he's alive and the amazing contribution he made. Clark spent a decade searching for Mercury's lost vocal track of Time, according to Yahoo, and said I thought: I'd like to hear the original show, but I couldn't find it. That's because we made so many tracks. I sent my engineer down and we went through [the vaults]. Couldn't find it. So I let it go. A few years later, I said, 'Come on. Go through all the banks again.' Clark's perseverance paid off. He worked on the field for two years, according to CBS News, and created a version that just had Mercury's legendary voice. Clark waited a while to release the song, and felt it would be wrong to release it during the promotion of the film Bohemian Rhapsody. He eventually included track to Queen manager Jim Beach. He came to my house, and before we started talking, I said, 'I have something I want to show you that can make you smile.' I didn't tell you what it was. He loved it, Clark said, as reported by Yahoo. Clark uncovered the song in recognition of Mercury's talent. I've done this [Time Waits for No One] for a tribute to Freddie, Clark said.
