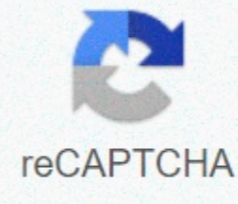

With land and sea borders, Greece has the 11th longest coastline in the world at 13,676 km. Olympus is the highest peak in Greece at 9,573 feet. The country is divided into geographical areas: Central Greece, the Peloponne, Thesalia, Epirus, the Aegean Islands, Thrace, Crete and the Ionian Islands. Thanks to the mountainous terrain, the rivers are not navigable. Since 2016, there are approximately 11 million people living in Greece. About two-thirds of Greeks live in urban areas such as the capital and largest city, Athens. About 98% of Greeks are ethnic Greeks, while the minority is made up of Turks, Armenians, Macedonians and Bulgarians.Greek historyThe scientific Greece is considered the cradle of Western civilization because of its pioneering ideas in philosophy, literature, historiography, politics, mathematics, science and drama. Around 2000 B.C. The Minoici of Crete were the first great civilization in Greece until the Mycenaes were conquered from the mainland in 1450 B.C.In ancient times, Greece was ruled by nobles and was divided into independent urban states known as poleis (polis in a unique form). Some of them included Sparta, Athens, Corinth and Thebes.Around 508 B.C.C Cleisthenes.In. The victory was followed by 50 years of peace known as the Golden Age of Athens.A lack of political unity often bought conflict and war between city-states. Between 431 and 404 B.C war broke out and the Spartans won. It was Philip of Macedon, along with his son Alexander the Great, who united mainland Greece and conquered the earth to expand the empire. In 330 B.C. After his death, the empire was divided into the Seleucid Empire, Ptolemy Egypt, the Kingdom of Greece-Bactrian and the Kingdom of Indo-Greek. The abyss gave way to the Hellenic civilization that spread Greek culture and In the 17th .C, Greece was conquered by Rome and became part of the Roman Empire. In the 18th century, Greece suffered barbaric invasions and raids Empires.In by the Goths, Huns and Slavs until the 7th century. Russia, The United Kingdom, and France have sent their navy to Greece to oppose the Ottoman Egyptian coalition. In 1863, Prince Wilhelm of Denmark, known as George I, brought Dyna as the new monarch after his coronation. Since then, Greece has faced a series of political disasters and reconstructions. Today, Greece is a single parliamentary republic in which the head of state is elected by parliament for a five-year term. The current Constitution provides for the separation of powers between the executive, legislative and judicial powers. It also strengthens civil and social freedoms, including women's right to vote. In addition to its rich ancient history, the Greeks are also known for their vibrant cultures and mythologies. Greek structures, especially in the Kycedi islands, are painted turquome because of their ancient belief that it keeps away evil spirits. Ancient Greeks are also guided by mythology, including Mt. Olympus as the home of all gods and heroic figures such as Hercules, Achilles and Perseus.Greek myths have also been used to explain the changes of the seasons based on the story of Hades and Persephone. Homer's Iiada and Odyssey highlight the Trojan War with elements of the Greek gods and goddesses. In addition, the famous judgment of Paris has become a popular scene for choosing the most beautiful women. The first Olympic Games were held in 776 B.C. in honor of the Olympian gods. The Hoplites are ancient Greek soldiers who wore 33 kilograms of bronze armor. Pythagoras, Euclid and Archimede were some of the Greek intellectuals who laid the foundations of modern mathematics. Herodotus was the first Greek historian and father of history after writing a book about the Greek-Persian War. The Greeks regard the English poet Lord Byron as a national hero after spending their money supporting Greece and fighting for it during the War of Independence. In 534 B.C., the first Greek tragedy was carried out by Thespiis, priest of Diviše. Classicist philosophers like Socrates, Plato and Aristotle were all Greeks. Ostracism was a famous method of expulsion of a person considered dangerous to the public. The name of the citizen was written in a piece of pottery called ostracon, in which the person with the greatest number of names needed to leave the city for 10 years. Traditionally, gods and goddesses have been listed on Greek coins. The national flag of Greece was officially adopted for the first time at the first national assembly It is popularly called sky-blue-white. The Greek flag has nine blue and white horizontal stripes representing the blue sea, sky and white sand of Greece. The Greek Orthodox cross is represented in the upper right corner of the flag. The geography of the region helped shape the government and culture of the ancient Greeks. Geographical formations, including mountains, seas and islands, formed natural barriers between Greek city-states and forced Greeks to settle along the coast. Map of modern Greece Aegean Sea The Mediterranean region where the Greeks first settled is called the Aegean Sea. Greek urban states formed throughout the Aegean coast and on many Aegean islands. People from Greece used the Aegean Sea to travel from city to city. The Aegean Sea also provided people with fish to eat. The mountains of Greece are full of mountains. Approximately 80% of the Greek mainland is mountainous. This made it difficult to travel long distances on the ground. The mountains also formed natural barriers between the main urban states. The highest mountain in Greece is Mount Olympus. The ancient Greeks believed that their gods (Twelve lived on top of Mount Olympus. The Aegean Islands are home to more than 1000 islands. The Greeks have settled on many of these islands, including Crete (the largest of the islands), Rhodes, Chios and Delos. The climate in ancient Greece generally represented a hot summer and mild colds. Because it was so hot, most people wore light clothes most of the year. On the colder days of the winter months, they put on a cape or wrap. Regions of ancient Greece Regions of Greece The mountains and seas of ancient Greece formed several natural areas: the Pelopone - Pelopones is a large peninsula located at the southern tip of the Greek mainland. It is almost an island and connects only with the main country a small strip of land called the isthis of Corinth. The Pelopone was home to several major Greek city-states, including Sparta, Corinth and Argos. Central Greece - North of the Pelopone is central Greece. Central Greece was home to the famous Attica region and the city-state of Athens. Northern Greece - Northern Greece is sometimes divided into three main regions, including Thesaly, Epirus and Macedonia. Mount Olympus is located in northern Greece. Islands - The main clusters of Greek islands include the Kyced islands, the Dodecanese, and the northern Aegean Islands. The great cities of the Ancient Greeks spoke the same language and had similar cultures. But they were not one great empire, but they were divided into a number of powerful city states, such as Athens, Sparta, and Thebes. Greek settlements the Greeks have established colonies throughout the Mediterranean and Black Seas. This included settlements in today's Italy, France, Spain, Turkey and parts of North Africa. These colonies helped spread Greek culture throughout the region. Interesting facts about the geography of ancient Greece The Greeks called their country Hellas. The English word Greece comes from the Roman word for the land of Graecia. Under Alexander the Great, Greece grew into a great empire that included Egypt and stretched all the way to India.
