For the Quinn family, the only way to survive is to live on, but when Stephen's grandfather dies and his father suffers potentially fatal wounds, they are forced to stop moving for the first time in his life. Stephen and his father are welcomed by the small subsistence community of Settler's Landing, but he knows from the beginning that he is not entirely welcome. Dan Bittner's Tale of The Eleventh Plague Jeff Hirsch, though not enough to make him an advocate, is solid, well-made and a blessing for the book itself. I had seen several 'meh' reactions to this tone before I tuned in, and I'm not sure if it was very 'meh' about my own previous hearing (Fever 1793), but I found much easier to incorporate and wrap into the history of the Eleventh Plaque than I expected. I love the fact that Hirsch is a pretty unique point of view and reminded me a little of Margaret Atwood's The Handmaid's Tale, which also takes place in a generation that can remember what society was like before. Stephen's parents and grandfather were there for the release of P11 and the war, they experienced everything and loved each other so much that they brought a child into such a world, regardless of the dangers. Stephen has never known a life other than that of a mountain rescuer who traveled on annual trade routes from Canada to Florida, never took the same path, and never dealt with the plight of others. When he and his father are brought into the settler's landing community, Stephen is like a conical animal who doesn't want to believe he's not ready for slaughter. He has never seen houses in use, slept on a real bed or eaten three square meals a day. He has drilled the ideas and meaning of the family into his head, but suddenly these definitions are called into question, and the concept of friends is also introduced. I felt that Hirsch had left us in Stephen's head during these foreign experiences, and the reactions of the people in Settler's Landing, both welcoming and aggressive, seemed very real in the current state of the world. The problem, however, was that I kept waiting for the true story to begin – and then realized too late that this was the reason. If the book trailer has a tag line like The Only Way to Survive, I expected him and Jenny to take off and survive alone – I expected a survival story in general. It wasn't really. The Eleventh Plague is certainly a story of survival, but unlike what I expected (and somehow desired). It was more about the survival of civilized society and building the future than about a more primitive sense of the word. I didn't really feel the relationship between Stephen and Jenny either. about her, but in a way, she is different, not in a romantic way. Jenny is constantly escalating, I felt like there was no real development the two would have given what would have been okay if it had been a more physical relationship, but it suddenly seemed as if Stephen did not want to live without this girl who destroyed the lives of everyone around her. As much as we were in Stephen's head, I didn't understand Jenny's thought process at all. She seemed like yours Angry eteen, but I couldn't help but be shocked that no one ever screamed at her You don't know how good you are! She wants nothing more than to free herself from settler landing, but as someone decent from Chinese, the outside world would be ten times more dangerous to her than the enemy than stephen and his family. That is never mentioned, and that surprised me. Some of the adults didn't make much sense to me either. I've never known a teacher who would give only half of the participants in a combat detention, but maybe that's just me. These problems aside (the first one I recognize is completely my own fault for my mindset before listening), I enjoyed listening), I enjoyed listening to the Eleventh Plaque. I appreciate it so much when this kind of book exists as stand-alone, and always enjoy a good male view that I think Jeff Hirsch provided by the character Stephen. I loved that in a world that had fallen apart, the past and the future came together and blurred the lines between them to form the present. The Eleventh Plaque is a powerful reflection on what a future of biochemical weapons could bring, how easily we fall apart, and what it takes to come together.
