Support – A horizontal area of the chart where you can expect the buyer to push the price higher. Resistance - a horizontal area on the chart where you can expect sellers to push the price lower. Here are some examples... Support and Resistance to EUR/USD Daily: Support on (USD/CAD): Resistance to (GBP/JPY):Also: Support and resistance can swap the role. This means that when support breaks there can become resistance. And when resistance breaks can become a Support.An example... Previous support turns on resistance (GBP/AUD):P turns on support (NZD/USD):But why did this happen? Because when the price breaks support, traders who are long lose money and in the red. So, when the price piles back into support, this group of traders can now get out of their losing trade on breakeven - and that will trigger selling pressure. And that's not all, because traders who missed the breakout will want short markets that increase sales pressure. And that's why when support breaks tends to become Resistance.Make sense? Now you're probably interested... But how do I draw support and resistance on my charts? That's a good question. So, here are the instructions that I use... Zoom out charts (at least 200 bars for me) Draw the most obvious levels (if you need a second guess, then that's not an important level) Adjust your levels to get as many touches (it can be body or wick) Now, if you want full training on how to draw support and resistance, then check out this video below... Other... Dynamic support and durabilityS based on classic technical analysis, support and resistance, horizontal areas Chart. This is useful when the market is in a range or weak trend. But in strong trend markets it's not going to work well, and that's where you have to rely on dynamic support and resilience.What the hell is dynamic? This means encouraging and resisting a move along with the price instead of being static. For example: A 20-period moving average can act as a dynamic support in a strong trend market... Or a 50-period moving average can act as a dynamic resistance in a healthy trend... Pro Tip: Dynamic Support & Resistance can also be in the form of Trendline or Trend Channel.Here's the deal:The markets are always changing (I'm sure you'd realize this by now). It can be uptrend, downtrend, range, low volatility, high volatility, etc. But if you take a step back and look at the big picture, you'd realize that the market tends to be in 1 in 4 stages... AccumulationAdvancingDistributionDeclining/I'll explain ... Stage #1: Accumulation StageThe accumulation phase occurs after a price drop, and it looks like the scale of the market in the downtrend. Here are the things to look for: Occurs after the price has fallen over the last 5 months or more (on a daily time frame)It looks like the scale of the market with obvious support and resistance areas – in the downtrendThe 200-day moving average is flattening out the price whips back and forth around the 200-day moving averageThing here is an example... Stage #2: Advancing stage The advancing stage is an uptrend with a series of higher elevated and low elevated. Here are the things to look for: Occurs after the price breaks out of resistance in the accumulation stage You will see a number of higher peaks and lowsPrice is higher than the 200-day moving average200-day moving average starts to point higherHere what I mean ... Now there's a thing ... No market goes out forever. It eventually gets tired, and that's where it enters phase 3... Stage #3: Distribution phaseDistribution phase occurs after the price increase, and it looks to scale the market in the uptrend. Here are the things to look for: Occurs after the price has risen over the last 5 months or more (on a daily time frame) It looks like a range of market with obvious support and resistance areas - in the uptrendThe 200-day moving average is flattening out the price whips back and forth around the 200-day moving averageThing looks like this... At this point, the market is still in balance with buyers and sellers on an equal footing. However, the tide has turned if the price breaks below the support, and this is where we enter the final stages... Stage #4: Decreasing phaseClinical phase is a downward trend with a number of lower elevated and low. Here are the things to look for:Occurs after the price breaks out of support in the distribution phaseYou will find a number of lower lows and lowsPrice is below the 200-day moving average 200-day moving average starting point Example... And if you have any problems trying to identify the direction of the trend, then go watch this training ... Now you might think... What's the point of learning phase 4 of the market? Here's the thing: If you can recognize the current phase of the market, then you can adopt the appropriate trading strategy for the trade. Here's how... If the market is in the advancing phase, then you want to be a buyer (not a seller). This means that you can look at buying breakouts or pullbacks. Or... If the market is in the distribution phase, then you know that there's a huge potential downside if the price breaks below Support.This means that you can look for a short distribution of support or wait for the split to occur, then sell it for a pullback. Now, once you understand phase 4 of the market, then you will know which price action trading strategies to use in a given market state – and you will never be lost again. At this point: You have learned the big picture of Stock Price Trading.You know where to enter your trades (promotion and resistance) and what you should do in different market conditions (4 phases of the market). But there's one more part of the puzzle missing, and that's when you enter the store. So, this is where candlestick designs come into play. Let's dive into ... What is a candlestick pattern and how does it work? Candlestick pattern has 4 data points: Open - opening price High - highest price for a fixed period of timeLow - lowest price for a fixed period of timeClose - closing priceHere is what I mean: For bull candles, the open is always below close. And for a bear candle, it's always open above the close. Next, you will learn several powerful candlestick designs to help you better time your records... HammerShooting StarBullish Devours PatternBearish Devours PatternI'll Explain... Hammer Hammer is a (1- candle) bullish reversal pattern that forms after the price drop. Here's how to recognize it: Little to no upper shadow And that's what Hammer means... When the market opens, sellers have taken control and pushed the price lowerOn the sales climax, huge buying pressure has entered and pushed the price higherBuilding pressure is so strong that it has closed above the opening priceln a nutshell, the hammer is a bullish reversal of the candlestick pattern that shows the rejection of lower prices. Now, just because you see Hammer doesn't mean the trend will reverse immediately. You'll need more confirmation to increase the chances of a business working out and I will cover that in the details later. We're moving on... Bullish Engulfs PatternA Bull Devours Pattern is a (2-candle) bullish reversal candlestick pattern that forms after a price drop. Here's how to recognize it: The first candle has bear nearTeleo second candle completely covers the body of the first candle (regardless of shadow)The second candle closes the bull and this is what the bull's devour pattern means ... At first candlelight, sellers are in control as they closed lower for a second candle, strong buying pressure entered and closed over the previous candle's high - which will tell you buyers have won the battle for Nowln Essence, a bullish immersive pattern telling you buyers have overwhelmed sellers and are now in control. Finally, Hammer is usually a bullish devouring pattern at the bottom time frame because of the way candlesticks are formed on multiple time frames. Here's what I mean: Meaning? Shooting StarA Shooting Star is a (1- candle) bear inverted pattern that is formed after an advanced price. (The opposite of Shooting Star is Hammer.) Here's how to recognize it: Little to no lower shadowThing price closes at the bottom of the 1/4 range The top shadow is about 2 or 3 times the length of the body And that's what Shooting Star means... When the market opens, buyers took control and pushed the price higherOn the purchase climax, huge sales pressure entered and pushed the price lowerSale pressure is so strong that it closed below the opening priceln a nutshell, Shooting Star is a bearish reversal of the candlestick pattern that shows the rejection of higher prices. And one more... Bearish Engulfs PatternA Bearish Devours Pattern is a (2-candle) bearish reversal candlestick pattern that forms after advanced pricing. Here's how to recognize it: The first candle has a bull's closeTem second candle completely covers the body of the first candle (regardless of shadow)The second candle closes bearishA this is what bearish engulfing pattern means ... At the first candle, buyers are in control as they closed higher for a periodon the second candle, the strong sales pressure entered and closed under the previous candle is low - which will tell you sellers have won the battle for nowln essence, Bearish Engulfing Pattern tells you sellers have overwhelmed buyers and are now in control. Nwo... What you have just learned are some of the strongest reversing candlestick designs. But they're not the only ones out there. In fact, there are many variations that make it impossible to cover them all in one blog. But the good news is that you don't have to remember candlestick designs to understand what the market is saying. Here's how... This is important, so be careful... #1: Trending MoveI'm probably wondering: What is a trend move? Trending Move is a longer foot trend. If the candles are large (in the uptrend), it signals strength as buyers are in control. If the candles are small, it indicates weakness, because are exhausted. Example Trending Move:#2: Retracement MoveA Retracement Move is a shorter foot trend. If the candles are large, it signals that the pressure against the trend is increasing. If the candles are small, it's a healthy pullback and the trend will likely continue on its own. Example retracement Move:#3: Swing PointsSwing Points refers to swing highs and lows — the obvious points in the chart from which the price is reversed. Here's an example: It's important because you know if the market is in an uptrend, downtrend, or range. As a guideline: If swing highs/lows move higher, then the market is in the uptrendIf swing highs/lows move lower, then the market is in the downtrendIf swing highs/lows don't move higher or lower, then the market is in the range Now, if you want to see them discover the secrets of chart patterns, then click here to find out. Other... If you want to understand all the candlestick patterns, you just need to know 2 things... Where did the price come close to the ranges? What is the size of the pattern in relation to other candlestick designs? Let me explain ... 1. Where did the price come close relative to the margins? This question lets you know who is in control for a while. Check out this candlestick pattern... I'll ask you... Who's in control? Well, the price has closed near highs from the range that tells you that buyers are in control. Now check out this candlestick pattern... Who's in control? Even if it's bull candle sellers they are actually the ones they control. Why? Since the price closed near misses the range and it shows you the rejection of higher prices. So remember that if you want to know who is in control, ask yourself... Where did the price come close to the ranges? Other... 2. What is the size of the pattern in relation to other candlestick designs? This question lets you know if there is any strength (or conviction) behind the move. What you want to do is compare the size of the current candle with the previous candles. If the current candle is much larger (than 2 times or more), it will tell you that there is strength behind the movement. Here's an example... And if there is no force behind the movement, the size of the current candle is about

the same size as the previous ones. Example... Does that make sense? Great! Now you have what it takes to read any candlestick pattern without remembering a single one. At this point: You have learned the basics of price action trading (Support & Resistance, market structure and candlestick patterns). Now, let's use this knowledge to find a high probability trading setting – consistently and profitable. Market structurePart valueEntry trigger!! explain ... #1: Market structure Now I know that it can be daunting looking at a blank chart. Because you don't know what to do. Should you buy, sell, or stay out? That's why the first thing you need to do is identify the structure of the market before telling you what to do. So ask yourself: Is the market in uptrend, downtrend, or scope? (In other words, identify the current phase of the market.) Once you can identify the structure of the market, then you will know the trade along the way least resistance. For example: If the market is in an uptrend, you look to buy it only. If the market is in the downtrend, you look to sell only. If the market is in range, you can buy and sell.
