My glass is overflowing. Explanation and commentary of Psalm 23:5This is a powerful picture of what it means to walk with God. There is nothing to fear in the darkest valley (Ps 23:4). We're the sheep of his pasture. It will protect us, provide us with food, give us shelter and gently correct us when we are misled. Our legacy from the Lord includes his kindness and mercy (P.S. 23:6). With faith, we walk with the Lord in all the trials of life. Unfortunately, many Christians struggle with great fear because of their reluctance to surrender to God all their lives. We are not in a position to protect ourselves in the valley of the shadow of death. We are not in a position to withstand the presence of our enemies alone. No one's ever heard of a lone sheep. And sheep without a shepherd (Mount 9:36) are only harassed and helpless. Breaking the basic parts of Psalm 23:5 #1 You can prepare a table before me ... The picture here is impressive. God, the Lord of the universe would serve our table. When we surrender our lives to Him, we find him capable of providing more than enough for us. He is an abundant provider to those in his household, and his children never go begging for bread (Ps 37:25 #2), in the presence of my enemies. Again, the picture is impressive. Imagine yourself at a nice table enjoying a feast. All around are all the demons of hell and the people in your life who hate you the most. And they can't touch you. You can forget it's there because you're not being asked to protect yourself. You have a shepherd who has very good staff. You can eat peacefully. We can abandon God's purposes for us fearlessly because we fear and love the Chief Shepherd above all things#3 You anoint my head with oil; The sheep were anointed by shepherds to keep out the deadly bugs. God protects us from the things that would hurt us. The image is also a reminder of the cast of oil poured over the Psalmist's head by Samuel (1 Sam 16:13) to single him out for the work that had called him, as king of the people of God. Then I put out the condiments - butter, salt and pepper, cream, sauce, and ketchup for the kids. Ended. Ended. it's a beautifully defined table. That's kind of what the Lord does for us. In verse 5 of Psalm 23, he prepares a beautiful table for us, only that instead of being with friends and family, he is set before our enemies or opponents. Why is God doing this? Many people believe verse two is where God promises to provide for us. Remember, that verse was to make us lie on green pastures (Psalm 23:2). Now we know that green meadows mean something else. The painting, however, is a better illustration of how God provides and satisfies us, Provision and Satisfies u your soul feels satisfied. Even if you have walked through a dark valley, perhaps the darkest of all the valley, vou'll find his sacred table. The painting depicts abundance, satisfaction, and eternal love. The people of God can enjoy at His table endless love and grace and no enemy of any kind can ever take it away. They can only feel annoyed that you were victorious and prosperous despite them. To repeat the point, the psalmist reminds us of valleys and the table of God again in Psalm 118:5–6:I called the Lord into danger. The Lord answered me and put me in a broad position. The Lord is on my side. I won't be afraid. What can man do to me? And, in the New Testament, Peter says it again in 1st Place Peter 1:3:You who gave me all the things that concern both life and piety, all the things that are required for both the body and the soul, for time and eternity. Don't give in to Satan's lies and tricks. Keep walking with God until you reach His sacred table. It is there you will find what you are looking for in great abundance

- its provision and absolute satisfaction. Sounds incredible, doesn't stop there. Anointing OiThe second half of verse five says, You anoint my head with oil; My glass is running. Every time we read in the Bible of the word something or someone, it is a beautiful depiction of God's blessing. But, it's not just a blessing for now or even in your current situation. According to bible scholar Matthew Henry and the full commentary of the Bible written in 1710, God's anointing in this verse refers to The One who blesses you for your entire life with the Holy Spirit so much that the cup of salvation Overflowing. Its anointing is not only to meet your needs, but also to give you ornament and pleasure. In other words, after bringing you through the dark valley, you can look forward to the victory of reaching the Lord for the victory of reaching the Lord god hits you in the back and says, Well done! The whole experience serves to strengthen our faith, to keep us closer to our heavenly Father and to realize how faithful he really is. If we can grab this, then we can boldly proclaim without hesitation the truth of verse six:Surely goodness and mercy will follow me all the days of my life and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever God is FaithfulPsalm 23 is a famous chapter of the Bible in a profound sense that is particularly encouraging in times of trouble, whatever it may be. I have thought many times of God's words and promises in Psalm 23 and have brought amazing comfort to me when it seemed that there was no way out of the valley. Now I know... Shepherd's rod and staff protect me because he calls me his. It provides my daily needs and gives me peace when I don't know what tomorrow will bring. He keeps me on the right track and helps me make the right choices so I don't wander away from him. I never have to be afraid because he's always loyal. After passing through the valley, he prepares a table of abundance for me and blesses me with the Hol

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
