Anthony Edwards (Mark Greene) Although he left after his eighth season, Anthony Edwards' Mark Greene was considered the er's main character as Chief Resident. He was basically the center of most of the plots. Edwards was already known as an actor in movies and television before the ER began. If you lived in the mid-1980s, you know his iconic role as Nick Goose Bradshaw in 1986's Top Gun. He was also in Revenge of the Nerds and later had a star turn in Mr North. On TELEVISION, he took a memorable turn as Mike Monroe on Northern Exposure, just before landing the role of Greene on ER. His character was killed at the end of season eight, freeing him to other things he did a lot. Although he took a little break from movies, his TV roles are still plentiful, including guest pictures on Blue Bloods and a recurring role in Designated Survivor. Sherry Stringfield (Susan Lewis) Considered one of the most important characters, Susan Lewis had an interesting trajectory in the show. The actress portraying her, Sherry Stringfield, left the show at the end of season three to raise her new family, then disappointed producers and fans. She returned to reprise the role later, then left the show again before the series ended. Stringfield eventually became an inspiration to other actors not to be afraid to leave the show in favor of their personal lives. Since leaving the ER, she has worked continuously in various television shows and television roles. You've recently seen her in the recurring part of Criminal Minds: Beyond Borders. Noah Wyle (John Carter) Noah Wyle had only a few roles in movies and television when he won the role of John Carter in ER. He is one of the few cast members to stay out of the show for the longest time, something you might argue could potentially typecast him. Fortunately, he was able to rediscover himself as an actor exit the ER. He was on The Librarian TV series and the popular sci-fi series Falling Skies. Additionally, he acted in critics romanoffs. Eriq La Salle (Peter Benton) and Gloria Reuben (Jeanie Boulet) Both Peter Benton and Jeanie Boulet dated briefly on the ER, but they did not stay together. Both characters - played by Eriqa La Salle and Gloria Reuben, respectively - remained with the show for a long time. Both returned in the ER finals as special guests. Over the past decade, you've seen La Salle in various tv spot guest roles, including cult favorite Under the Dome. Reuben received several nominations for her role as Elizabeth Keckley in Steven Spielberg's Lincoln in 2012. On TELEVISION, she was seen on all the best TV shows, including as a regular on Mr. Robot. George Clooney (Doug Ross) Clooney is a household name and has gained even more fame since his time on the ER. He became a megastar who starred in many critically acclaimed films. He has also produced and directed several films. The previously infamous bachelor tied the knot with human rights lawyer Amal Clooney and shares twins with his wife. ABC's 2004, mysterious drama Lost crash-landed on the airwaves and kept audiences confused and intrigued for six seasons. The ABC show was full of clues about the survivors of the plane crash, the flashes in their old lives and their attempts to survive on an abandoned island with others wreaking havoc. She is also the author of children's books and writes a series of books The Squickerwonkers. 7 of 32 Then: Jorge Garcia As hurley lottery winner, Garcia won the hearts of the audience as a sweet everyman of the show. 8 of 32 Now: Jorge Garcia After starring on fox prison drama Alcatraz, Garcia joined his fellow Lost alum Daniel Dae Kim in the cast of Hawaii Five-0 and was part of that cast until the show ended this spring. 9 of 32 Then: Josh Holloway Played James Sawyer Ford, a handsome Southern Con man who loved a good book and both Kate and Juliet. 10 of 32 Now: Josh Holloway Post-Lost starred in the FBI intelligence series and sci-fi series Colony. He can now be seen as the hedge fund manager Roarke Morris on the Paramount Network Yellowstone program. 11 of 32 Then: Yunjin Kim Played the Sweet Sun, who slyly pretended not to speak English when he first arrived on the island. 12 of 32 Now: Yunjin Kim has starred in the tv series Mistresses for some time and is now starring in the South Korean tv series Ms. Ma, Nemesis. 13 of 32 Then: Terry O'Quinn as John Locke, was a spiritual and mysterious survivor who was convinced that the island was wonderful because it restored his ability to walk. 14 of 32 Now: Terry O'Quinn Had a recurring role in the drama Hawaii Five-0, starred in the short-lived series 666 Park Avenue and Secrets and Lies and had a recurring role in the Hulu series Castle Rock.
