Summer session ucsc financial aid

Financial Assistance Overview Entering the first year and transfer students have the opportunity to start their undergraduate careers by participating in Summer Edge 2020 remotely. To help with the cost of participating in Summer Edge, our office offers grants of up to \$2,800 based on financial needs determined by the FAFSA or Dream Application. The average budget estimate for Summer Edge Students is \$4,600 which includes tuition, housing, personal expenses, books and supplies, and transportation. Fafsa Eligibility Requirements 2019-2020 or Dream Application is required for new students to receive financial assistance for the summer quarter of 2020. This is in addition to fafsa 2020-2021 or Dream Application that you must apply for the upcoming school year. Submit FAFSA 2019-2020 or Dream Application no later than June 27. Students selected for verification,* must submit the necessary documents to receive financial assistance. Summer Edge is 7 credits (minimum). You must register and complete all courses to maintain relief eligibility. If you applied for financial assistance at a previous institution for 2019-2020, make a correction to this FAFSA or Dream Application and include the UC Santa Cruz School Code 001321. Estimated Financial Assistance for Summer Edge You can use us to get an estimate of the total amount of grants you may receive for Summer Edge. We encourage you to complete your 2019-20 financial assistance application first and use the expected family contribution (EFC) of this app to get an estimate. You can also use the EFC defined by your 2020-21 financial aid application. This calculator generates estimates based on the information you provide. If the information you provide is incorrect, your estimate may differ significantly from the final award offered. All estimates are subject to availability of funding. Please note: This calculator only provides the total estimated amount of grants you expect to receive for a 7-credit Summer Edge. If you plan to take an optional Session 1, 8-wk, or 10-wk course the amount of your help may increase. Loans will be offered to meet participant fees that are not covered through grants. In addition to verifying certain tax information about federal tax returns, UC Santa Cruz uses in-depth analysis when providing our own institutional grant funds. Your financial assistance offer can be customized as a result of the verification process. Federal, state, and institutional assistance is most often adjusted due to factors such as the amount reported in households/colleges, untapped income (pension contributions, foreign income exemptions, asset depreciation, Social Security benefits, etc.), investment net worth, and tax filing status. Am I eligible to receive help for the summer? To be considered for summer assistance, you must register by June 1. Undergraduate students must apply for a minimum of 10 credits to be considered for campus-based assistance. For state and federal assistance, you must enroll in a minimum of 6 credits. If you are a graduate student, you must apply for a minimum of 5 credits. Do I need to be enrolled in more than 6 credits to attend summer school? A student can attend summer if they choose to enroll in less than 6 credits. A minimum credit of 6 is only for students who wish to be considered for state and federal student aid. If you can pay out of pocket and/or through other means, this credit limit does not apply to you. If I have been accepted back to UC Santa Cruz fall, can I attend the summer? Students who have been accepted back to the University for the fall and wish to attend summer sessions need to get approval from their College Advisors and submit the FAFSA for that academic year. What types of help are available during the summer? For eligible undergraduate students, the Summer UC Santa Cruz Grant may be available to help cover some of their tuition and expenses. Undergraduate students who plan to graduate by the end of the summer can use Cal Grant in the summer if they have remaining eligibility. Graduate students enrolled over the summer in the five-quarter UCSC Master of Education program who receive Cal Grant as undergraduates, are eligible to apply to extend their Cal Grant for a fifth year. Submit form G-42, Cal Grant Year 5 Benefit Request for CSAC. If the student has not used the entire their loans during autumn, winter, and spring, they can use the rest during the summer. Parents can apply for PLUS to help undergraduate students with the cost of attending summer sessions. Parents can borrow up to the full cost of summer, less than the financial assistance students receive. Postgraduate students can apply for Grad PLUS to help assist attend classes in the summer. If I plan to attend another UC over the summer, am I eligible for financial assistance? If you plan to enroll in another UC Campus, you must complete and submit a Summer Intercampus Financial Assistance Application to our office by June 1st. Students should not expect to receive as much financial assistance as is available during autumn, winter and spring. If you enroll in another UC Campus, your financial assistance from UC Santa Cruz will be paid to you directly and it is your responsibility to pay your summer fees. Do I need to pay my summer fee before my aid is disbursed? If you are eligible for financial assistance, the Summer Sessions Office will NOT require you to pay tuition and fees before you receive your assistance. Your financial assistance will be applied to the cost of your Summer Session a few days before the start of the session in which you are registered. If your help does not pay all your costs, you are responsible for paying the remaining fees. Due to COVID-19 concerns, our office will have limited service availability. Federal and state assistance applies first to fees on student accounts, followed by institutional awards and/or other types of personal assistance or payments. As this process progresses, students may notice changes to their anticipated assistance, rewards, and fees. It is important to note that due to federal regulations, the disbursement of financial aid eligible for the coming quarter will take place between 3 and 10 business days prior to the start of the instruction. Financial aid is posted to student bills on the schedule below. You will not get a late fee if your assistance is disbursed on time and covers your entire bill. If your help doesn't cover your bill, reduce help you from the amount you owe and pay the difference with the due date of the fee. Note: The Financial Assistance Fund cannot be applied to the cost of the previous academic year. Students must pay the fees charged in previous academic years independently of the disbursement process of financial assistance. To enroll in summer classes: simply go to my.ucsc.edu and add summer classes to your cart as you do for the rest of the year. January - Summer Courses and instructors are available on our website March 15 - Course details are available in Class Search May 1 - Enrollment is open to all students If you apply to graduate in the spring, you will not see the option for summer classes. To fix this, you need to change your Proposed graduation to summer by submitting an Apply/Apply for Graduation (Undergraduate) form to the Registrar. If you enrolled at UCSC in spring and didn't sign up to graduate, but didn't see an option for summer enrollment, email summer@ucsc.edu. Include your Student ID# in your question. If you didn't take classes this spring but have attended UCSC in the past and didn't graduate, visit our former UCSC students page for next steps. Because enrollment for the summer quarter is optional, students are not considered part-time or full-time. If you pay out of pocket, no minimum credit is required (Financial Aid eligibility has a minimum). You can't reload a class until your grade post fails. There is no minimum credit in the summer. There is a maximum credit of 15 per session. There are 30 maximum credits for the whole summer. If you want to exceed this maximum, you will need permission from your college advisor, who must send an email summer@ucsc.edu with permission. FYI If you're in the summer prasyaf during the spring quarter, that's great – your portal will see spring classes and allow you to sign up in the summer. If you need a Summer Session 1 class that is a pre-start session 2 class, sign up for Session 1 class. Contact our office (summer@ucsc.edu), and we can get you enrolled in Session 2 class. If you fail the spring class you want to take back in the summer, you need to wait until the spring class post to add a summer class. You have to drop yourself. Instructors don't drop students for not attending. If you are enrolled, you will be responsible for paying tuition, unless you drop by the deadline. Once you get off, your tuition will be recalculated within 24 hours, removing tuition fees for the credits you drop. No fees courses this summer. For 2020, a refundable \$50 cancellation fee if you drop all your summer classes is suspended. Deadline Check our calendar for session dates and add, add, and draw deadlines during the summer.
