George j. mitchell scholarship

The Mitchell Institute unlocks the potential of Maine students to contribute to the vitality of their communities. Every year, we award scholarships to public high school graduates in Maine who continue their higher education. The 2021 Winners of the Mitchell Scholarship, representing more than 130 high schools from each community in Maine, each will receive a scholarship award of \$10,000 to be paid in four equal installments of \$2,500. In order to help more Maine students achieve higher education, the Mitchell Institute provides scholarships for Maine students planning to participate in two and four years of study at colleges both in- and out of state. After selecting scholars, the Mitchell Institute helps them navigate college and the world through personal and professional support. In addition to offering scholarship financial support, the Mitchell Institute offers a wide range of personal, academic and professional support programs, as well as a network of more than 3,000 Mitchell Scholars, alumni and partners, all of which amount to far more than a check. 2021 Mitchell Scholarship Application Link Click on the Apply icon below for information on eligibility and application process. Eligibility for scholarship and selection criteria To be eligible for consideration, the applicant must be a legal Maine resident and graduated from a public high school in Maine in spring 2021. Students who attend a public school in Maine but come from households from outside Maine are not eligible to apply for a Mitchell scholarship. Applicants should plan to participate in a two-year or four-year study programme at an accredited college or university in the autumn semester immediately after graduating from secondary school. Students continuing their two-year course of study are eligible for a maximum of four years of scholarship support if they continue their education after the first two years. Candidates are assessed on the basis of the following criteria: academic potential, community impact and financial needs. 2021 Mitchell Scholarship Application: To apply for a Mitchell Scholarship, eligible high school students must submit an online application form between January 1 and April 1 in the spring before they are completed. This is an exciting opportunity for these Scholars to meet with our employees, board members and Scholars. Brunch Save the Dates: MILE I: October 10, 2020 MILE II: March 7, 2020 Mitchell Institute offers annual leadership and professional development events, known as Mitchell Institute Leadership Experiences (MILE): MILE Weekend I is an experiential educational program, including an outdoor exploration and group social services project held at Baxter State Park in Millinocket. Throughout the weekend, scholars develop leadership skills and build relationships - all while trailing the river, reaching the Katahdin summit or discussing professional ethics at the table. These interactions build a lasting community, connect and equip scholars with resources that foster success during and after college. As many as sixty Mitchell Scholars attend the Oct. MILE II is a full-day career and personal development event organized by Unum in Portland in March. About eighty Mitchell Scholars and graduates meet with professionals from a wide range of career fields to experience full speeches, interactive workshops and networking opportunities. Planning for this engagement and an insuching day is led by members of the Mitchell Institute's Board of Graduates. MILE I & MILE II Institute signature program, our Scholarship Awards offer support to qualified scholars and graduates in their pursuit of internships, learning services and study experiences abroad that offer steady personal and professional development. These funds empower scholars to seek enriching opportunities, regardless of financial factors. Each year we award about 50 Fellowship Awards from \$500 to \$1,500 to scholars and graduates. The periods for applying for the scholarship are from 1 October to 1 November, as well as from 1 March to 1 April per year. The Mitchell Scholar Awards scholarship receptions are held on as many Maine campuses as possible and are run by college or university presidents. All Mitchell scholars on a given campus are invited to attend, as well as Mitchell Scholar Alumni in the area. These meetings provide an opportunity for scholars for years to come together, as well as key programs and academic leaders on their campuses. Topics covered at these receptions range from upcoming Mitchell Institute events and opportunities to study abroad, to staying in touch with others Mitchell on their m.in. Campus Receptions Promise Fund was established in 2012 to provide one-time emergency grants to scholars who are facing unforeseen financial crises. If not funded, these are the types of barriers that could derail the scholar's ability to stay in college. We know from experience so far that hidden costs and even modest unexpected financial obstacles can derail a promising Scholar without a financial safety net. These one-off lifts are considered and awarded through one-on-one consultations between Mitchell Institute staff and researchers. The Promise Fund George J. Mitchell Scholarship is a scholarship awarded annually by the U.S.-Ireland Alliance to fund postgraduate studies in Ireland. The first class of scholars began their studies in 2000. The scholarship is sometimes compared or grouped with other international scholarships for American students, such as the Rhodes Scholarship and the Marshall Scholarship. Each year, about 300 young Americans apply for 12 scholarships. The George J. Mitchell Scholarship is organized under the auspices of the U.S.-Ireland Alliance, a nonprofit nonprofit based in Arlington, VA. The programme began in 1998[3], created by US-Ireland Alliance President Trina Vargo with early support from the Irish and British governments. Over the past decade, the program has been largely funded by the US State Department, with additional support from the Northern Ireland Government, Becton Dickinson and Cross Atlantic Capital Partners. In 2010, the Irish Parliament passed legislation that would respond to any contribution, up to €20 million, to the end of the scholarship programme. The Mitchell Scholarship Award covers tuition, accommodation, airfare, cash scholarship and other benefits such as a travel scholarship to encourage travel both in Ireland and beyond and northern Ireland. In recent years, Mitchell Scholars have used their travel scholarships to explore countries as diverse as Oman, Cambodia, Senegal and Azerbaijan. The Mitchell Scholars Program, named after former U.S. Senator George J. Mitchell, a key contribution to the Northern Ireland peace process, aims to introduce and connect future American leaders to the island of Ireland and to recognize and support intellectual achievement, leadership and commitment to community and public service. Mitchell scholarship program graduates have pursued careers in consulting, law, academia, politics and journalism. Notable alumni include Arsalan Suleman, acting U.S. Special Envoy to the Organization for Islamic Cooperation; Matt Haney, President of the San Francisco Board of Education; Ty McCormick, African Foreign Policy magazine; Jimmy Soni, former editor-in-chief of the Huffington Post; and Dr. Thomas J Vitolo, an American consultant on 15, 2015, in Norfolk. Placement Mitchell Scholars are placed at universities in the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland, including Trinity College, Dublin, University College Cork, University of Limerick, National University of Ireland, Galway, National University of Ireland, Maynooth, University College Dublin, Dublin City University, University of Ulster and Queen's University Belfast. Controversy In 2012, the State Department tried to eliminate funding for the program, but with the support of several members of the United States Congress; university presidents and professors; in the form of petitions; and the Governments of Ireland and Northern Ireland, this decision was reversed in the financial year 2013.
