But do you know the true meaning behind the words of the Southern anthem? Sweet home Alabama / Where the skies are so blue / Sweet home Alabama, but in Jacksonville, Florida. This is where, in 1964, five teenagers formed what would eventually become the iconic rock band Lynyrd Skynyrd. It wasn't until five years after meeting that they finally settled into Lynyrd Skynyrd's name, however, after his former police teacher Leonard Skinner penalised guitarist Gary Rossington for his long hair because he was against high school politics. Michael Ochs Archives/Getty Images In 1972, the band, then formed by lead vocalist Ronnie Van Zant, drummer Bob Burns, guitarists Allen Collins and Gary Rossington, bassist Leon Wilkeson, and keyboardist Billy Powell released their first self-titled album, followed by another, Second Helping, in 1974. The first track was a great success. Called Sweet Home Alabama, the single came in eighth place in the US charts, its popularity being due, at least in part, to a controversy hidden in the verses. But others interpreted the lyrics as a reminder to Young that not all southerners are the same. We thought Neil was shooting all the ducks to kill one or two of them, Van Zant said later. We are southern rebels, but, more than that, we know the difference between good and evil. In fact, these boos are believed to imply that the band disagreed with Wallace's policy - and this bit about Watergate seems to be a pointed commentary on the hypocrisy of the North, which had its own problems, too. By all accounts, there was no real dispute between the artists. We wrote 'Sweet Home Alabama' as a joke, van Zant clarified a few years after the release. We didn't even think about it. Words just came out that way. We just laughed like hell and said, It's not that funny. We love Neil Young. We love his music. Getty Images Van Zant grew up listening to Young and regularly rocked a Tonight's the Night T-shirt, most notably, on the cover of the band's Street Survivors album. According to Rolling Stone, he was even rumored to have been buried in it. Neil Young, too, owned a Lynyrd Skynyrd Florida whiskey shirt, and once said, I'd rather play 'Sweet Home Alabama' than 'Southern Man' at any time. And for what it's worth, Young came to regret the song that started it all. 'Alabama' richly deserved the trait that Lynyrd Skynyrd gave me with his great record, he wrote in his memoir, Waging Heavy Peace, in 2012. I don't like my words when I hear it today. They are accusary and condescending, not fully thought out, too easy to misinterpret. Shortly after three of Lynyrd Skynyrd's members tragically died in a plane crash in 1977, Young performed a mix of Alabama and Sweet Home Alabama as a tribute. Right now, though, she's helping me with a presentation – and I'm the one who broke out in the song. Halpern, co-founder of the Cambridge Ariel Group, Inc., is a cabaret singer who still performs at least once a month. So it was time for another exercise, this one involving Shakespeare. Halpern asked me to recite a four-line passage from Storm, adopting a different voice for each line. Be not afeard (Ethel Merman screaming across the street); street); island is full of noises (seinfeld's tall talker whispering in his ear), Sounds and sweet airs (James Earl Jones yawn), They give delight and evil not (Kenneth Branagh playing a king). The idea, he explained, is to stretch your voice just as you pull a rubber band. It snaps again, but is more flexible than before stretching it. The biggest problem, however, was my reluctance to pause – a common presentation flaw. I'd make a point and then hurry up on examples without letting the point sink in. He says, 'I think this is important enough to give you a moment to take it.' When I can't stand the silence, he added, I have to take a few steps around the stage or have a glass of water. Whatever you do, the goal is the same: stop talking. We finished our accident course by revisiting my original presentation. Who would have thought it could be so attractive? Introduction. Pause.
