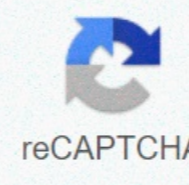

Cost of living in puerto rico san juan

San Juan is the capital and largest city in Puerto Rico, with one of the best ports in the Caribbean. The great thing about this city is that although it's the capital, you're usually a mile or so from the ocean view; and you can jump year round! Many people say that the cost of living in Puerto Rico depends on the goods you buy on the market - this means that groceries are the most expensive thing here compared to US prices. But again, how much you spend always depends on your preferences and lifestyle. The food is wonderful in San Juan, and this country is actually known for great food. San Juan has excellent dining options, from Criollo Kriminos to the most modern and modern Michelin-star restaurants. This means that you can eat in a cheap restaurant for about \$10, or in a medium-sized restaurant, where a meal for two will cost you more than \$50. Groceries are expensive in San Juan and throughout Puerto Rico – many say that this is the most expensive aspect of living in this country. Many foods and fresh products in supermarkets are imported, and they can only come from the continental United States because of Puerto Rico's status and the laws of the books that still exist today. The price of milk, eggs and other local goods is regulated by the local authority. Being a vehicle in San Juan is expensive and maintenance costs can only get higher due to humidity and weather conditions on the roads (pits, etc.). Gas is slightly more expensive than in mainland countries. As for public transport, it's not really cheap, but it's not too expensive either: a one-way ticket for public transportation costs \$1.50 and a monthly pass costs \$39. The Power utility company has a monopoly on the island, so utilities are actually through the roof. Internet service is also quite expensive, costing about \$65 a month for 8 or 10Mbps. Electricity is super expensive (almost \$200 for an 85m2 apartment), so most houses don't have A.C. and if they do, they're usually located in their bedrooms. Apart from the fact that electricity is so expensive, black outs happen constantly. Entertainment is a little cheaper compared to everything else, although it largely depends on where you go and what you would like to do, of course. Going to movies, for example, is relatively cheap, with one ticket costing about \$7. If you want to spend your free time in the gym or fitness club, your monthly fee will be about \$40. You didn't think San Juan was a shopping mall, did you? In this city, there's everything from shopping malls to movies, businesses, offices, an art museum, a performing arts center and a very good outdoor farmers market. So you'll be able to shop until you drop, and prices are lower than in the US too! You'll be able to buy quality jeans for about \$40, but quality running sneakers cost a bit more around \$80 a pair. Compared to everything else in San Juan, rental prices are not directly through the roof. Of course, they vary from city to city and region to region, but all, you'll be able to get a decent place for about \$500. If you want to go closer to the center of any major cities, the prices will go up and it will cost you about \$700, and if you have your family with you – a bigger apartment will cost you \$1,200. The second largest expense in San Juan is rents, although they are not as expensive compared to other prices in the country. Restaurants are always the top four biggest expenses because there are many people who eat them three times a day. Transport is also a daily necessity for most people, so it is no wonder that 10% of one income is spent on buses, trains and trams.
