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## Seven lakes basin permit

In a high-heeled address to a press release sent by Olympic National Park officials, it was announced that the magnificent and very impressive Seven Lakes Basin area of the Olympic National Park will not be closed from July 9 to 20. This news means that you can back it up in this amazing area! However, there is a catch. You must get permits to camp in these wonders in backcountry personally. The following is the text of the press release: The administrative closure of the Seven Lakes Basin/High Zone from 9 July to 20 July is no longer in force. The Seven Lakes Basin is a share area and permits will be issued on a first-come basis, first served for backpacking trips during this time frame. Permits will be available in person from the day before the flight. Pre-booking requests for these dates will not be accepted. There are currently four sites for a permit, but only two are open on weekdays, so plan accordingly. More information on seven lake basin distance: 19.3 mile backcountry camp reservations episode: Permits required and must be obtained at wildlife information centres. Backcountry camping areas: 7 days recommended: 3-5 days is one of the most popular backpacking trips in the Olympic National Park, and those who get permission to the Seven Lakes Basin are rewarded with eye candy from mountains, lakes, animals and forests. Aptly named, the aquarium is full of lakes, mountain goats (but not for long), wild flowers, and incredible views of glaciers around the Olympic mountain range. Starting with the always impressive Sol Duc Falls, trail heads along the Sol Duc River, earning in height before depositing hikers in alpine wonderland. With camps around the lakes, it may be difficult to find your favorite destination, as every lake Beauty is unparalleled. The highlights are probably heart lake and lunch lake, but Lake Hoe and Deer Lake are also quite spectacular. The best seven lake basin episodes take place during clear summer nights, when after spending a day exploring the lakes and hills of the area, you can sit back and enjoy one of the best stargazing scenes in the park. Click here for more information regarding the Seven Lakes Basin ring in the Sol Duc Valley is one of the country's prime back rises in the Olympic National Park. This 19-mile episode features a large variety of backcountry camps, as it features links to the River Ho Eriver Trail and Appappton Bass (Elwha). Starting at The Sol Dock, you'll quickly reach the intersection of the seven-ring lake basin within the first mile. Take the right hiking to Sol Duc Falls, Deer Lake, and Lunch Lake. Take a left for a walk along the Sol Duc River, to Sol Duc Park and Heart Lake. In the middle of the point and the highest point of the ring is the High Gap Trail, which offers some incredible sweeping vistas of the summit of Bogachel, Mount Olympus, the River Valley of Huh, Billy Range, the Seven Lakes Basin, and the Sol Duc Valley along the way. Camping permits/reservations: Camping is limited throughout the year, and permits are obtained at the Wild Information Center in Port Angeles during working hours. Reservations are recommended between May 1 and September 30, during the booking season, 50% of camping sites can be booked. Food storage method: All food, garbage and scented items must be stored in garden-approved bear enclosures in the Sol Duc/High Gap/Seven Lake Basin area, including all nearby camps surrounded by the Deer Lake Trail, the Sol Duc River Trail (High Division Ring), adjacent camps along the Mink Lake Trail, the High Divided East Trail, and the Cat Basin Area. Location and locations: Camping is permitted only at selected locations. Major destinations include Sol Duc Park, Heart Lake, Lunch Lake and Deer Lake, each with multiple camps. Between Sol Duc Falls and Sol Duc Park there are many comfortable camps and water. There are very few camps and little water between Heart Lake and Deer Lake. Lunch Lake is accessed by spur trail 0.5.0.. Camping sites are heavily used over 3,500 feet. Camping boundaries in place for all areas in Sol Duc Basin / Seven Lakes, Cat pool and bear swimming pool Mink Lake, Little Division, Lake Hoh/C.B apartments. Camping is permitted only in selected locations. The group's sites are located in Sevenmile Camp, Sol Dock Park, Deer Lake and C.B Apartments along Hoh Lake Road. Toilet facilities: Sol Duc Park, Heart Lake, Lunch Lake, and Deer Lake have cellar toilets. To prevent these toilets from filling too quickly, do not urinate in these toilets. Urinating on rocks or on the trail at least 200 feet from the camps and water sources. This prevents deer and goats from pulling up plants to get salt in the urine. In other areas, solid waste is buried 6-8 deep and 200 feet from camps and water sources. Water sources: Sol Duc River, tributaries and lakes. Always overheat, filter or treat your drinking water chemically to prevent giardia. Stock: Camp only at designated stock sites in Horsehead and Deer Lake (llama only). The Olympic National Park comprises nearly a million acres, protects the vast wilderness with thousands of years of human history, and many distinctly different ecosystems, including glacier-covered mountains, old temperate rainforests, and more than 70 miles of land coast. In December 2016, Congress renamed the Olympic Wilderness as Daniel J. Evans wilderness to honor Senator Evans' dedication to preserving our wildest places. Wild Daniel J. Evans is one of the wildest remaining places in the lower 48 states. Permit & season information is required for all overnight stays in the wild throughout the year. A permit allows the permit holder and their group to camp in a specific camp area. Land information centres are currently closed for personal visits, all permits must be booked in advance. Your permit will be issued by WIC staff 5-7 days before the start of your journey. We'll email instructions on how to print your statement when it's issued. Tryprinting before the release will result in an error message. Reservations become available 6 months in advance on the rolling window at 10:00 am EST/7:00 am PST. Although the park is open all year round, reservations for the country's high-rise areas are limited to a shorter summer season due to snow. Please contact the Land Information Centre at the Olympic National Park for more information. Need to know when planning your trip, please keep in mind: Land information centres are currently closed for personal visits, all permits must be booked in advance. Your statement will be issued by WIC staff 5-7 days before the start of your journey and you will be able to log into your account and print your own statement. Permits are available through advanced booking through Recreation.gov. If you are unable to find a road or camping site, please contact one of the wildlife information centres. All food, garbage and scented items must be stored in a certified bear Wild coast, in the Royal Basin/Royal Lake Area, Enchanted Valley Area, Sol Duc River Area/Upper Gap Ring Area including Lake Mink area, Cat Basin and all other areas in the main drainage wilderness of Sol Duc Fork. Permit holders can borrow bear packages free of charge at wild information centres. Bear enclosures are also required in areas where food cannot be suspended at 12 feet and 10 feet from the tree trunk, such as the Bailey range and similar areas. Camping is only permitted in the camp area specified in your route. The maximum group size is 6-12 depending on the camp area. The permit holder must be at least 16 years of age at the time of purchase. Those aged 15 years and younger are free but must be included in the group size. Their groups may not unite to form a group of more than 12 people at any time, and must camp and travel at least one mile away. The maximum share is 8; inventory is prohibited in some areas of the camp and on some routes. Pets and weapons other than firearms, vehicles, bicycles and other wheeled devices are not allowed on park trails, lawns, beaches or in any undeveloped area of the park. The use of firearms in the national park is prohibited. A fishing license is not required for hunting in the Olympic National Park. Groups of seven or more camping in the Sol Duc Basin/Seven Lakes, The Ho Trail River, The River Hoh Valley, The Grand Canyon, The Royal Basin, Flagjack Lakes, Lake Constance and the upper Areas of Lake Lina must camp in specific locations for groups. Leave any trace please follow all the principles of leaving any trace including: plan ahead and prepare, travel and camp on durable surfaces, dispose of waste properly, leave what you find, reduce the effects of campfire, respect wildlife and observe other visitors. Registration policy fee: Adults (16 years and older) - \$8 per person per night youth (15 and under) - Free Olympic National Wild Park Bass - Free for pass holder only booking fee: A reservation fee of \$6.00 is required non-refundable for each one-night permit reserved including annual Olympic National Park Wild Bass Holders. Policy cancellation policy: You can cancel your booking seven full days prior to the booking date and receive a refund. Booking fee of \$6 is non-refundable. Change Policy: You can make any change to your route if the space is available until the day before the booking date, and before your permit is issued at the Wilderness Information Centre (additional charges may apply). Once your permit is issued, you cannot make changes to the permit unless approved by a guard at the Wild Information Center.
