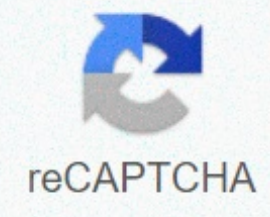

Whether you're a parent who can't find money in this year's budget or you're trying to increase your budget, here are some ways to get free school supplies for your child this year. The first step in getting free school supplies is to contact your child's school. Often, schools buy additional supplies each year so they can provide for families who can't live.
