The book is mainly an analysis of the theory of capitalism and money [1] which was achieved by criticising the writings of the theoretical exponents leading capitalism at the time: these were political economists, often referred to today as classic economists; Adam Smith (1723–1790) and David Ricardo (1772–1823) are the most important representatives of the genre. Materiality Much of the criticism was later added by Marx to his magnum opus, Capital (Volume I), published in 1867. However, this does not apply to the foreword to criticism. It contains the first connected story of one of Marx's main theories: the materialistic concept of history and the model of the basic and superstructure of the society involved, which divides human social development into an economic and technological base, which conditions – not determine – forms of its own political ideological superstructure.
