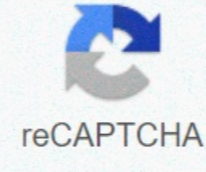




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## Wyoming department of education special education

For the first time, states passed mandatory education legislation in the 19th century to improve public morality and provide basic education for all future citizens. Today, rigorous education is seen as essential to success in the modern world. Many state constitutions require their governments to maintain free primary or secondary schools, and state universities further emphasize this commitment to education. Here's a quick summary of compulsory education in Wyoming. School attendance is required from seven to sixteen All children must start school if they reach the age of seven or before September 15 this year. Parents can send their children to a public school, choose a private school, or organize home school that meets the requirements of the state. Compulsory education is legally required until the child reaches the 16th or 10th grade. Parents who do not meet this requirement can be convicted of a misdemeanor punishable by up to a \$25 fine and ten days in a county jail. There are several exemptions to this act. First, the district board of trustees may provide exemption if it considers that compulsory participation would be detrimental to the mental or physical health of the child or to other children at school. Secondly, boards may also grant an exemption in the event of excessive difficulties. Finally, the law on compulsory schooling does not apply to students who have been lawfully suspended or expelled. Home teaching is provided for in the law of Wyoming compulsory education. Reading, writing, mathematics, citizenship, history, literature and science instructions are required. All home school programs must submit a copy of the curriculum annually to the local board of trustees to ensure that these standards are met. Home school programs are also not required for teaching and are not required to refrain from teaching anything that is contrary to its religious doctrines. Code 21-4-101, and then The age at which school attendance is required from seven to sixteen years of age or to complete the tenth grade. Exceptions to attendance requirements When the school board considers that participation is detrimental to the mental or physical health of a child or other child; where participation would be excessively difficult; when the child attends a home school or attends a private school; suspended or expelled. Home School Provisions Home schooling must meet the requirements of a basic academic educational program, including reading, writing, mathematics, citizenship, history, literature and science; the parent must submit a teaching to the local school board. Penalties on parents for misdemeanor incompatibilities punishable by up to a \$25 fine and 10 days in a country prison (21-4-105).
