Contact paper for kitchen cabinets

To create a one-of-a-kind sofa table, place three to five kitchen floor cabinets side by side and join them with wooden screws. Standard cabinets are in 3-inch (7.6-centimetre) wide increments, ranging from 12 to 60 inches (30.5 to 152 centimeters) wide; The number of cabinets you use will depend on the length of your sofa. You can choose to leave the cabinet doors in place for storage out of sight or remove them to turn cabinets into display shelves. Advertising After the cabinets have been affixed to each other, it's time to put the icing on the cake.
