I know to use *67 at home when I want to do this, but the set of cells is different - you don't get that double tone set so you know you're now limiting your number. From your cell, just start the number you're calling from *67 as if the phone number starts with these three digits. It's important to remember that you'll need to put 1 in front of the area code because cells don't normally need 1.For example, type *6719175551212 before clicking the discussion button will cause the receiver caller ID to read limited.
