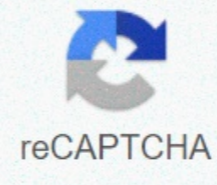

The Guilford County Detention Center - Greensboro is located in Greensboro, North Carolina. The Sheriff's Office oversees and manages this prison. This facility serves the community of Guilford County. If an inmate receives a sentence of less than 24 months, it will be sent to the state. This facility has 5 offices, 7 deputies, an administrator and 2 financial employees. In addition, this facility has 2 supervisors who have had quality training. The offenders will be placed in this facility if they have committed crimes in County Guilford. The Guilford County Sheriff's Office is responsible for the care and custody of inmates imprisoned in three separate detention facilities, the Greensboro Detention Center, the High Point Detention Center and the Sheriff's Prisons Farm. Our goal is to provide a safe and sanitary environment for inmates, visitors and staff while maintaining safety for the community. Approximately 19,000 inmates are on detention facilities each year. The average daily population in all prison facilities combined exceeds 800 inmates. Due to the size and population of Guilford County, detention facilities are maintained at three locations in Guilford County: Greensboro, High Point and Gibsonville. All facilities are governed by the same policies. Inmates can be assigned or transferred anywhere at any time. There are many reasons why a person can be detained in the county jail. The following is a list of some of these reasons: One person has been charged with a crime in Guilford County and is awaiting trial. These offences can go from a traffic violation to murder. A person has been found guilty of a crime and is awaiting a sentence. A person has been convicted less than a year for a crime, and is serving that sentence in county jail. A person has been sentenced to a year or more and is awaiting transfer to the North Carolina Department of Corrections to serve that sentence. A person can be held at the Guilford County Jail on an order from another jurisdiction pending transfer to that jurisdiction. Regardless of the reason someone is in sheriff's custody, certain services should be provided. In many ways, prison is its own city. Cash is accepted for inmates until Friday from 8:00 to 16:00 hours except during visiting hours and holidays. Orders for money, certified cheques or ATMs can also be received via email. Inmates scheduled to appear for the High Court or Federal Court may change the clothes that were admitted to the facility for clothing brought by their family or friends. The schedule of this exchange is: Monday - Friday 8:00 am -- 4:00 pm (except during visiting hours and holidays)In the case of a family crisis or death contact the chaplain of the sheriff's office at (336) 641-3099 in Greensboro or (336) 845-6970 in High Point. The priest will inform the inmate of family death or family crisis. An inmate can receive letters with a full return address on the envelope. You can receive five photos (no more than 5" by 7") by mail. They can receive regular size greeting cards, without shine on them or those with sound generating devices. They can receive internet pages as long as it is not an excessive or indecent amount. They can not receive mail that is not sanitary (with lipstick, etc.) in it, newspaper clippings, pages torn from books or magazines, without drawings greater than 8 " by 11", without stickers in the envelopes (apart from an address label), no bookmarks, no calendars, no items stuck or engraved, or requests of any kind. You can buy a newspaper or magazine subscription for the inmate, but you can't leave newspapers or magazines for them or email them yourself. Journal subscriptions will not be accepted if it is considered a security risk. Inmates can receive incoming mail from Monday to Friday except holidays. Inmates can receive newspapers and magazines (which are not considered a breach of security) and any other legally permitted publications that may be delivered through the U.S. Postal Service. Inmates can receive up to 5 pocket books (without hardcover books) that are sent directly from the publisher, Internet distributor or book club, as long as they are not considered a security breach. Books that are ordered and sent directly from bookshops will not be accepted. The materials, which are considered security breaches, will not be able to access any detention facility. Examples of security breaches would be elements that encourage criminal activities, represent activities that could lead to physical violence or disruption, contain explicit sexual content/nudity, escape methods, or weapons. Items that are not allowed will be returned to the sender. Only mail arriving through the U.S. Post Office or the legitimate postal service will be delivered. Mail will not be accepted or released from the reception lobby area. Mail must be addressed correctly and contained return address. To ensure proper and appropriate delivery, ensure that the inmate's identification number is included in all correspondence. Incoming mail without return address will be discarded or discarded in the postal service. Newspaper clippings and posters will not be accepted. In addition, greeting cards of more than 6" x 8" or cards containing 'sound generating devices' will not be accepted. Inmates may release funds or personal assets to persons designating, during the following hours: Monday / Friday: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. (except during visiting hours and holidays) In order for an inmate to release money or goods to an individual, the person receiving the money or property must be at least 18 years old and must possess a valid state-issued photo ID, military DI or government-issued passport. The visitor's name must be on the approved visits list, which is filled out by the inmate during the admission process. Only two names can be placed in the list. The list can be reviewed or updated every thirty days. Visitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult unless they are considered legally adults (emancipated). Visitors can visit only once a week. People who live more than 80 miles away from the facilities where the inmate will be staying and who are not on the inmate's list can have a unique special visit in one go. Inmates on suicide watch are only allowed visits from lawyers unless the division's commander, office commander and medical staff. Adults and teenagers (between 13 and 17 years old) must present a valid state-issued image ID for each visit before they can visit it. All visitors will be required to successfully pass through a metal detector (additional searches may be required). Visitors will make sure of all personal goods (wallets, outerwear, diaper bags, strollers, cigarettes, lighters, mobile phones, pagers, etc.) before being admitted to the premises for your visit. Ticket offices are provided in the visitor's waiting area for use. Locker rental is .50 cents. Visitors cannot bring any items with them during the visit. Any visitor who attempts to provide contraband to inmates will be subject to suspension or revocation of visitation privileges. If the item attempted to be delivered to the inmate is a weapon, alcohol, drugs, or other contraband, criminal charges can be initiated against the visitor. Professional visitors (lawyers, approved clerics, probation, etc.) do not need to be placed on the inmate's visitation list. However, if you are related to the internal, you will not be allowed to visit except in accordance with regular public visit guidelines. Any staff at the detention facilities have the right to refuse and/or restrict their visit at any time for violations of the policy. Policy.
