

The 28 lectures offer an elementary account of his views on the unconscious, dreams and the theory of neuroses at the time of writing, as well as offering new technical material to the most advanced reader. The lectures became the most popular and widely translated of his works. However, some of the positions described in the Introduction to Psychoanalysis should then be amended or revised in Freud's later work and in 1932 he offered a second set of seven lectures numbered from 29-35 - New Introductory Lectures on Psychoanalysis - as a supplement (although these were never read aloud and featured a different one, sometimes more polemic style of presentation.) In his three-part introductory lectures, starting with a discussion of Freudian slips in the first part, moving on to dreams in the second, and only dealing with neuroses in the third, Freud managed to present his ideas as firmly rooted in the world of common sense of everyday experience. Making full use of the lecture-form, Freud was able to engage in a live polemic with his audience, constantly engaging the reader/listener in a discussion, so as to take up their views and deal with their possible objections. The work allows the reader to familiarize himself with Freud's concepts to re-identify the logic of his arguments and follow his conclusions, supported as they were by examples from life and from clinical practice. But Freud also identified elements of his theory that require further processing, as well as bringing new material, for example for symbolism and primordial fantasies, assuming with the latter a train of thought that will continue in his re-work Wolfman. In the new introductory lectures, those about dreams and anxiety/instinctive life offered clear narratives of Freud's last thought, while the role of Superego received an update on lecture 31. Most popular treatments of occultism, psychoanalytical applications and its status as science helped complete the tumor. Carl Abraham's assessments considered the lectures elementary in the best sense, for presenting the basic elements of psychoanalysis in an accessible way. G.
