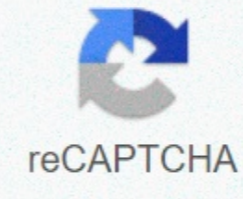

Chapter 22 Overview In our study of the American Civil War, students will examine a fundamental question: what factors and events influenced the outcome of the Civil War. At the beginning of the chapter, students will be assigned to either the Union side or the Confederacy of War, and they will then consider each event from that party's point of view. Throughout the chapter, students will have to write letters home from the battle front as a soldier responding to the factors and events we discussed. The highlight of the chapter will be an experiential exercise where students participate in the reconstruction of the Battle of Gettysburg. In addition, students will analyze primary and secondary source documents related to emancipation statements and Gettysburg addresses. The chapter processing task will require students to adjust and polish concepts created throughout the chapter into the final copy form.
