Building an army and attacking other villages is a lot of fun, but every minute you spend waiting for resources is a minute when you're not burning someone's village on the ground, so focus first on collecting resources and doing it well. Be sure to build the maximum number of gold collectors and elixir allowed by your town hall and level up those collectors as frequently as possible. The same applies to collectors of especially if you want to quickly level up the town hall. You need to be able to store resources in large quantities to allow you city hall updates, and especially in the early stages of the game this is very important. Your gold and elixir are produced in predictable rate. To optimize the number of times you're storing your clan, check out the information tab for your resource generators. You'll see how quickly each system produces gold or elixir, and the total amount of that resource that each system can contain before you have to download the resource to storage containers. Leveling up your town hall gives you access to a whole new range of things, and that almost always means it's time to build yourself a bigger base. If you have decided to build your walls larger than necessary, then there is room for expansion within your village, you will probably have noticed that the enemy sometimes generate havok. Repairing this is easy, as just move the walls or fill the space behind the walls, but it's important to remember that any gap within your village will leave an opening for your opponent to exploit. To create a zero-space base, move any building and pay attention to the white space inside your base, your opponent will have to lay eggs from the outside and fight to reach your village. This is also why you see people putting buildings outside their walls, as it increases the distance the enemy soldier has to travel to reach the base and leaves those soldiers open to be weakened by your defenses. Clash of Clans allows users to purchase shield time, which makes it possible that other players cannot attack you. It's a nice idea as the features go, but there's another way to get shields and while it's a little less dignified you don't have to pay the in-game currency to get it. After taking a beating, the game throws a shield for a set of time to help in the recovery effort. Both types of shields go away if you decide to launch an attack on another player and if you've been 100% wiped out by another player you probably don't want to. Pay attention to your shield time and use it to adjust your village so you can defend better next time. It doesn't take long to get out any little patch of land where you choose to on your map in Clash of Clans, and that means you have to spend some resources cleaning up the landscape. For lower-level people it is a kind of expensive enterprise, but it has to be done. Each map starts with 40 random obstacles on the map, with a couple of obstacles occasionally rescitting. Whether your opponent spams your village with warriors or there's a handful of giants smashing your walls, mortar turrets are your best friend if you use them the right way. Each turret has a clear advantage and disadvantage, but mortar's ability to deal damage to the area is a big deal for everyone. Unfortunately, as is often the case with mortars, there is a minimum range that they can fire to avoid dealing damage. You have to put your mortar in a place that defends your village as much as possible, but to keep it safe you have to make it difficult to get to that place. Use everything you think is best, including walls, traps, and even other defense turrets. The longer you can keep the enemy in that white ring, the greater your chances of success. Your Clan Castle is more than just a shining beacon that lets everyone know you're on a team. It's also an outpost for the soldiers of your other clans, and if you have troops in that clan castle, they could come to devastate your village. Unfortunately, you can't just train troops and send them to your clan castle. You must request troops from your clans, and any they provide you is what you get. Talk to your clanner comrades and form a plan for what troops are sent where. The number of troops you can keep depends on the level of your Clan Castle, so be sure to level up and make sure everyone in your clan requires troops like how as much as possible. 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
