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Turn of the century ceiling fan installation instructions

Installing a ceiling fan with lights is a process that requires attention to detail, but with the right tools and this guide, it may only take an hour or so to complete it. Installing Randy M.'s ceiling fan with light may seem like a daunting task, but with the right tools and methodical approach, it is a job that most useful people can handle. Below, I... describe the process of installing ceiling fans in locations where power lines already exist, such as in places where you already have a light equipment list of necessary tools and a step-by-step installation process, providing tips on important places where you have to pay special attention including photos to illustrate instructions and make some clearer points go to some corrections that may need to be done if there is noise or wobbly problems after installation. Tools NeededPhillips Screwdriver Drill and Bit Crescent wrench Wire cutter, or Dykes Wire Stripper (optional) 1. Open the Ceiling Fan Pack and Check the Parts The first thing you do after you collect the tools is check to make sure you have all the parts of the ceiling fan. Take it all out and check the list of parts provided by the manufacturer. Make sure all the pieces are there. Otherwise, take the box back and get another one, do an inventory before removing it from the store. Make sure the box includes all the parts you need to install a ceiling fan. Randy M.2. Install Mounting Platelf you install a ceiling fan, check the mounting area and make sure there is a 2 x 6 board installed between the rafters. This will provide a safe mounting surface on the dry wall ceiling. The wooden ceiling (as can be seen in my photo) can be strong enough to support the weight of the fan, depending on the thickness of the wood. Make sure that the board is in good condition and safely attached to the rafter support. Turn off the power service to the installation site. Flip off the fuse in the breaker. If you install a fan where there are existing lights, remove the existing lamp. Mark the spots on which the mounting plate will be attached to the ceiling. Drill a hole with a slight diameter that is about half the width of a screw thread. Put the plate in position, with an electrical cable inserted into the center hole, and screws in each large mounting screw. Ceiling fan parts: 1) mounting plate, 2) mounting ball on bottom rod, 3) bottom rod, 4) canopy/cover, 5) fan motor, 6) knife, 7) knife mount and 8) lamp. The fan motor installed in Randy M.Ceiling, shows the location of the downrod installation, where there are pins and two set screws. Randy M.3. Install Motor and Fan Raft You do the flush installation, you just have to attach the canopy/cover directly to the fan motor through the screws, avoiding steps 1-4. But if you don't do a flush seat... Insert down ball up, into the canopy/cover. Feed the electrical wires from the motor to the canopy and the bottom stem. Loosen the screw set at the top of the motor where the bottom rod is mounted. Insert the bottom bar into the connector at the top of the motor and connect the bottom bar with a brass pin, securing it with a cotter pin. Tighten the screw set to the bottom stem. Turn the ball so that the ridge fits inside the slot in the canopy. It'll lock it in place. Tap in the tab into the slot, if any. Then hang the canopy and motor on the hook found on the mounting plate. (If it's not there, you'll need a helper to hold the fan motor.) If necessary, cut the electrical wires coming from the ceiling so that they extend 2 1/2 to 3 inches. Connect the black electric wire to the black wire from the house and connect it white to white. Green wire is connected to the ground. Use a screw-on wire connector supplied with a fan; however, if you connect 3 cables (a black fan and a blue light wire to a black wire from the house), it would be wise to use a larger connector (yellow) versus a small orange connector. Make sure all connections are firm. You can put an electric tap on top of the connector where the wire comes in if you wish. Re-fold the excess cable so that it will fit inside the canopy and then attach the canopy to the ceiling mount. Tighten the screws and insert additional screws that will secure the canopy connection to the ceiling mount. Attach the fan blade to the fan blade with screws. Make sure the fan blades are oriented in the right direction (there may be different finishings on each blade surface and sit all screws firmly. Open the plastic delivery protector found at the fan blade mounting site at the bottom of the motor. Save screws and pitch protective delivery. Securely attach each fan blade to the motor. If necessary, attach the lamp to the bottom of the fan. Some lamps are more complicated than others, so follow the manufacturer-specific instructions for each lighting kit. Attach the switch chain to a chain that extends from under the fan motor and lights. 4. Make Necessary Post-Installation Adjustments Rarely, no adjustments required. But there are two situations that sometimes arise—swaying and exaggerated sounds. Excessive noise? Check back all your mounts and screws to make sure they are tight. Wobbling? Some shakes are acceptable. But, in cases where it is excessive, check to make sure all the screws attached to the knife and place the knife to the motor sit firmly. If this doesn't work, then you can switch two bars at once, testing after each change. Knife numbers with band covers and switched blades side by side 1 and 2, then 3 and 4, then 2 and 4 and then 4 and 3. This scheme will both models ceiling fans 4 and 5 blades. Installing The Light Kit on the FanSome Ceiling ceiling fan is installed without lights, although the kit after the market to add lighting can be installed later. If your ceiling fan is capable of installing lights, there is a housing under the motor that has wires and screw holes to install the light kit. Open the housing and check for lighting cables and screw mounts before you buy a lightweight kit. SummaryInstallation of a ceiling fan is a step by step process. A good installation is one that is done carefully, ensuring that all fittings are firmly secured. Problems are rare if a person is careful and thorough during installation. To replace existing light fixtures with a paddle ceiling fan: Turn off the power to the light in circuit breakers or fuse boxes. Remove the lamp, and remove the cable. Check the electric box to make sure it supports fan weight, and strengthen the box if necessary. Attach the fan cable to the cable in your home, following the manufacturer's instructions included with the fan. Hang the fan motor on the ceiling hook. Attach the fan trim mold to the fan pipe near the ceiling. Attach the fan blade to the arm on the fan motor. Turn the power back on, and test the fan. Watch this video to find out more. MORE INFORMATION VIDEO TRANSCRIPT To install a ceiling fan, you must first be sure that the electric box is sturdy enough to support the weight of a moving fan. Most begin with the mounting plate attached to the electric box. Often the plate has hooks to hang the fan motor when you make an electrical connection according to the fan's instructions. Then you will permanently attach the motor to the plate before assembling the fan blades and attaching them to the motor. If a lightweight kit is included, it will last, once again cable it according to the manufacturer's instructions.
