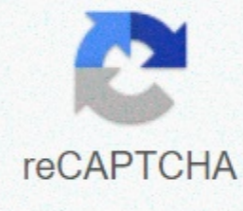

But how does a private school get you into college? The Association of Boarding Schools (TABS) investigated how prepared students were for the faculty. When asked, students who attended both boarding school and private schools reported that they were more prepared for college than those who attended public school in both academic and non-academic fields. Private school students were also more at odds to earn an advanced degree, as boarding school students come with the highest percentage of advanced degrees. Why is that? One reason is that private schools are designed to help pupils develop a love of learning, which means that they are more likely to continue their education outside of secondary school and undergraduate studies. It's not uncommon to hear that a private school graduate came back from his freshman year in college, saying it was easier than in high school. Private schools are strict and require many pupils. Because of these high expectations, students develop a strong work ethic and time management skills. Private schools often require pupils to participate in two or three sports and after-school activities, and in addition to their academics they also offer clubs and activities. This difficult schedule means time management skills and school work/balance of life are skills that students master before college. Students attending boarding school receive an even better preview of college life, more than students at a day school. For? Because boarding school students live in campus dorms instead of at home with their families, they learn what it's like to live independently, but in a more supportive environment than you could find in college. Student parents in boarding school play an active role in the lives of boarding school students, providing guidance and promoting independence as they learn to live alone. From cleanliness and rooms to timely waking up and balancing work and social life, boarding school challenges students to make responsible decisions. Private schools usually offer more as public schools, as these institutions lean towards enrolment of students from not just one city. Boarding school goes even further, welcomes students from all over the world. Like colleges, different environments provide rich experiences, as students live and learn with people from all walks of life. These diverse perspectives of current events, lifestyles and even pop culture references can improve the academic classroom and expand personal understanding of the world. The TABS study also shows that boarding school students report longer that they have high-quality teachers than private or public schools. In boarding school, teachers are much more than just teachers in the classroom. They often have coaches, parents in the home, counselors and support systems. It is common for boarding school students to stay in touch with their teachers long after graduation. Teachers in a private school usually not only have certificates of teaching, in fact many private schools value the experience over a teaching certificate. Teachers in a private school usually have advanced diplomas in their subject areas, and often have extensive professional backgrounds in their learning subjects. Most private schools boast small classes. In private schools, the average class size is often between 12 and 15 pupils, and NCES reports that the average classroom ranges from about 17 to 26 pupils, depending on the level and type of instruction. These smaller class sizes, which sometimes have more than one teacher, especially in kindergartens and elementary school programs, mean more personal attention for pupils, without the back line, and without the possibility of being overlooked in the debates. Teachers of private schools outside normal classroom times, especially in boarding schools, should also be available for additional assistance. This supportive environment means that students are given even more chance of success. Another benefit of boarding schools, especially when it comes to preparing for college, is the assistance that students and their parents receive in the process of applying to the faculty.
