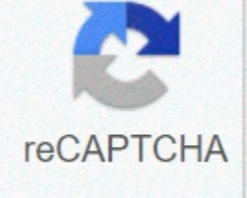

## Us news law school rankings 2020 leaked

We hope you're ready because it's almost the most wonderful time of the year for law schools. That's right, the 2020 U.S. News Law School rankings will be published on March 12, 2019. What is it? You don't want to wait until next week? Not we, so we've got a leak from the full 2020 rankings so you can feast on your eyes. Law school deans are saying their last prayers are rankings of God guru Bob Morse in the hope that they won't be ousted from their positions thanks to some lost spots on the list, while prospective law students are going to send out place deposits to law school with the best ranking. For current law students, they're just waiting to see if the school they'll graduate will be considered more or less prestigious than when they first decided to debt finance their future based on their alma mater's rank. Today's US News rankings leak comes to us courtesy of Mike Spivey of Spivey Consulting Group, who broke the news. For the past few years, Spivey has acquired law school rankings before their official publication, and they are always accurate. You can review them here, or on his blog here. Take a look at the new T14 law schools. We've got a brand new three-way tie: 1. Yale University 2. Stanford University 3. Harvard University 4th University of Chicago 5. Duke University (+1) 10. Northwestern University (+1) 13. Cornell University 14. Georgetown University UVA and Michigan switched locations, and Duke and Northwest are both back in the Top 10. Nothing terribly exciting happened in this part of the rankings this year. Now, let's gander at law schools outside of T14. Like years earlier, we are faced with yet another rankings, with nothing but links, links, and more links. In this classification segment alone there are four ties (two two-way ties, one three-way tie and one four-stroke tie), with more to follow. Here are the schools ranked 15-31: 15. Wake Forest University (1) The big winners here are Florida, UC Davis, and up to 10, six and five spots in the rankings, respectively. Congratulations to every school because they are doing something right to scale the rankings. The biggest loser in this segment of the rankings is Emory, with a four-spot drop (not too bad in the grand scheme of the 2020 rankings) that booted the school out of the Top 25. Ouch. Now, for the rest of the law schools top 48, where there is one tie, one triple tie, and two five-ties. As you can see, there was a lot of movement here: 34. Baylor University (+2) The biggest winners here were Utah and UNC, which moved up seven and 11 places in the 2020 law school rankings. The biggest losers here were Wisconsin, Washington and Lee, and Washington, with seven, eight and 12-spot drops, respectively. Whatever these schools do, they're better to build up because they've already shipped out of the Top 30 – and almost out of the Top 50. After rankings of hiccups last year that landed the school between unranked thanks to some misreporting, the school has jumped. Congratulations also go to both Northeast (+10) and Brooklyn (12). Well done! Now you may be wondering where Rutgers and Penn State schools are. They probably fall into this band rankings or next, but they're nowhere to be found at all. According to Mike Spivey, they seem to be listed unranked and we're trying to get an explanation. We will come back to it as soon as we get more information. Moving right, let's check out the school that makes up the bottom of the Top 100. If you thought the 12th-place laundry rankings were bad, you haven't seen anything yet. This ranking segment is the most unretreat yet, with two three-stroke ties, one four-stroke tie, one five-way tie, and one nine-way tie (seriously?). At the close behind was LSU, with a 12-spot drop. Let's not focus on these classifications of train wrecks when there's so much to celebrate here. Tulsa (+14), Florida International (+10), and Hofstra (+10) all deserve some recognition for entering the Top 100 this year. Nice job! Page 3 Now we will discuss the bottom third of ranked schools before testing schools whose ranks were not published (or were not supposed to be, you will see what we think). In this segment of rankings, between two ties, two, three-way ties, three knee ties, two five-way ties, one six-way tie, and one seven-piston tie, we see the biggest double-digit increase so far, as well as the most huge losses. We imagine that the annual activities of deans will begin shortly after the official U.S. News rankings are published. Moving on to things that aren't that nice, remember last year when Maine shot up 33 places, making history with one of the biggest rankings gains ever? Talk about rate adjustment. This year, the school slumped to the rankings, dropping down 20 spots in this year's biggest Dry. What the hell happened?! Also on the in this part of the rankings is Cleveland State State Washburn (-13), Mercer (-10), and South Dakota (-10); be careful, you're almost into RNP territory). These decaths have some splainin to do. All that excitement gives us the realm of Rank Not Published (RNP). Yes, these schools are ranked, but U.S. News usually reserves them numerically designated as some of the worst in the country – or at least that was what was supposed to happen. This time Mike Spivey was able to get his hands on the actual numerical rankings of these schools. Yikes! It's just stinging. Without further ado, here are this year's so-be RNP law schools: 146. These are schools that no longer exist (probably due to mergers), had ABA accreditation revoked, were placed on probation, been closed/closed, or may have had data reporting issues like that, U.S. News couldn't rank them. Here they are, in alphabetical order: Arizona Summit Law School Atlanta's John Marshall Law School Charlotte School Of Law Hamline University Inter-American University Pennsylvania State University (Dickinson) pre-2017 Pontifical Catholic University of Puerto Rico Rutgers, State University of New Jersey-Camden Rutgers, State University of New Jersey-Newark Of Law Here's an additional note from Spivey on certain schools that are not listed at all: There are several schools that would be on the regular USNWR list but do not appear to be included, either on a regular list or unranked list. These schools are Penn State University Park, Penn State Dickinson, Rutgers, Widener, Delaware, and Mitchell Hamline. These schools may have rankings published in US News, but we have no knowledge of what these rankings will be at this time. So what can be said about these law schools? Should you bother visiting one? Getting a degree from RNP law school might not be as prestigious as getting one of the higher grades in school, but a burst of elitist bubble: not everyone cares about prestige. Some of the people who apply for and attend these schools just want to be lawyers, and others just want to stay close to home. Some of these schools are doing very well in regional labour markets, and while Biglaw may not be an option for anyone, the rest is content to join small businesses or do public service work. But here's the rub when it comes to these RNP law schools... law school is not a golden ticket for quite some time, especially if you're a graduate of a lower grade school. Law school is a huge economic gamble, and the chances of getting a full-time, long-term job as a lawyer after graduation were 66.2 percent of the class in 2017, a percentage on which the 2020 U.S. News rankings are partially based. Once again, it's time to ask a very important question: How are the perspectives of law students supposed to differentiate between law schools when there are so many links in the rankings? In the 2020 rankings, there are 20 links in the Top 100 alone. Not only is it useless, but it's actually not bad for pre-court students. Should you really consider attending any of these law schools? The jury is still out. Due to all of this year's rankings links, there's no real way to see specific differences between them aside from their numerical rank without digging deeper through external sources, so it makes it much harder for potential law school applicants who can rely on US News to help them in their decision making.
