What is app icon badges s9

As informative as they may be, the new app icon badges and the unread number on the Galaxy S9 start screen are a little redundant because Android already has a notification center. The Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) just doesn't work like the old badge you're familiar with. This Galaxy S9 guide explains the differences between the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) and the old number badge and shows you how to customize the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points). What is the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points)? When you get a notification in the Galaxy S9 notification panel, by default, you'll find a digital badge in the upper-right corner of the corresponding app icon on the Galaxy S9 start screen and app screen. For example, as shown below, if you have 3 internet app notifications (browser application), the number (3) appears in the upper-right corner of the browser app icon. This number badge is commonly referred to as the Galaxy S9 notification number badge. Old Galaxy phones have had several tokens that look similar to the Galaxy S9 notification number badge. Since the Galaxy S9 notification number badge matches the notification points for android stock, the notification number badge was sometimes called galaxy s9 notification points. If you think the new Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) is just beautify the old version of the number badge, then you're wrong. What are the differences between the galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification point) and the old number badge? Although they look similar, the Galaxy S9 notification number badge and the old badge are two completely different things. The main differences include: The Galaxy S9 notification number badge is actually the notification points introduced in Android Oreo. The old number badge on Samsung phones is Samsung's proprietary introduction to TouchWiz (now the Samsung Experience). The Galaxy S9 notification number badge is directly related to notifications on the Galaxy S9 notification panel. The old number badge is not associated with the notification panel. The Galaxy S9 notification number badge works in all apps. The old badge only works with selected apps, typically Samsung apps and some pre-installed apps. The Galaxy S9 notification number badge counts only notifications, nothing else. The old number badge can count both notifications and unread messages, depending on your programs. The Galaxy S9 notification number badge will be cleared if you reject the notification. But about the old notifications in the notification panel does not clear the number badge. You must open the app to clear the number badge or manually clear it after the Nougat update. The Galaxy S9 notification number badge will normally not be cleared if you open the app without rejecting notifications. For an old number badge, the usual badge will be cleared after you open the app. You can customize or turn off the Galaxy S9 notification number badge even for individual apps. The old badge cannot be customized. You can preview the notification using the Galaxy S9 notification number badge. If you tap the app icon and hold it with the Galaxy S9 notification number badge, you'll see a notification snippet. You can then tap it to read the full statement in the Galaxy S9 notification panel. The old number badge is just a badge. So, apart from a similar look, the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) is completely different from the old number badge. Samsung Experience 9, apparently, Samsung abandoned the old number and switched to notification points that are baked in the android stock.If you rely on the old number badge to keep track of unread messages or announcements, you need to find other solutions. For unread notifications, you can use notice sretistination instead of rejecting it to keep old notifications alive. For unread messages or emails, this depends on the app you're using. You may need a third-party app. How do I customize the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points)? Samsung allows: Turn the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) on or off for the Galaxy S9+. The default is on. Choose a number or points to display in the badge. The default displays the number that is displayed in the badge. Turn notification preview on or off on the Start screen of the Galaxy S9. The default is on. Turn the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) on or off for individual apps. The default is turned on for all programs unless the notification is turned off for the program. You can customize the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) on the Galaxy S9 Settings.As shown below, on the Galaxy S9 settings page, tap the display (marked as 1) On the Display settings page, tap start screen as shown above. You can then find the app icon badges on the Start screen settings page. If you want to turn off the Galaxy S9 notification number badges, you can tap the switch on the right. You can tap the app icon badges as shown below to adjust it only when it's turned on (the switch is on the right). The app icon on the badge page has a switch again to turn the notification number badge on or off for the Galaxy S9 and S9+. If this switch is turned on, you can see other options that follow. You can choose to display a badge with a number (badge) or no number (points badge). Is allowed one choice. You you both (points plus number). Your option will be previewed immediately. Another option is to display notifications. You can decide if you want to preview notifications on the Galaxy S9 Start screen (without opening the notification panel). If enabled, after you tap the app icon with the badge, you can see the notification snippets after you touch and hold (long tap) the app icon. How do I customize the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) for individual apps? As shown above, you can tap Notifications (marked as 2) on the Galaxy S9 settings page to customize the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points, app icon badge). On the Notification settings page, as shown below, you can find the program icon badge entry (marked as 3). This program icon has an emblem entry identical to the settings page explained above. So, you can make all of the above customizations on the Notification Settings page. On the notification settings page, you can customize the Galaxy S9 notification number badge (notification points) for individual apps. For example, you want to turn off the notification number badge for Allo. On the notification settings page, tap the Allo app (marked as 4 in the screenshot below). On the App notifications page, as shown above, you can find notification settings for Allo. Allo app notification settings have the App Icon Badges field.
