It has also indicated that Schools, in 2003-2004, had a total revenue of \$452,437,000 [7] school board structure and elections are governed by Wichita Public School (USD 259) a nonpartisan elected school board, USD 259 board of education (BoE), which has seven members. Six board members in total are nominated by voters in six geographically defined board districts across the school district. There is one nominee from each district. The nominated people then run for election school-district-wide. The seventh board member is nominated, and then elected, from the massive school district. [8] [9] Elections are for four-year terms, and are held in odd numbered years (winners take office next January). Members are elected with staggered conditions (three members are up for election in 2020; then two years later the remaining four members are elected). [10] Alicia Thompson became superintendent in July, 2017 — the district's first woman and the first African-American to hold that position. Thompson's position before the superintendent is as assistant superintendent of the district for elementary schools. Thompson is one of the district's few superintendents to be promoted to that position from within the district, in recent decades; Most have come from outside the state. However, public voting, during the latest superintendent recruitment process, informed the Wichita BoE that the community strongly preferred a local person, from within the Wichita public school system, to the post. Thompson — who attended Wichita Public School at all levels, though high school graduate from kindergarten — served in the district as an elementary school teacher, principal and administration executive, before the appointment as assistant superintendent, then superintendent. [11] Thompson told Superintendent John Allison (who announced his resignation, to become superintendent of Olathe Public Schools in Olathe, Kansas); Allison served as superintendent since 2009, succeeding Winston Brooks who resigned in 2008. [10] [12] [11] In January 2018, Dr. Tiffany Irving, Superintendent of Assistant Learning Services, was named deputy superintendent of Wichita Public Schools overseeing all other aspects of primary and secondary schools, special education, SOL, early childhood, career and technical education and instruction. Assistant Superintendent is also separate assistant superintendent for elementary and secondary in the district. Michelle Ingethorn is assistant superintendent of elementary schools, and Gill Alveraj is assistant superintendent for secondary schools. These programs mainly served secondary school students but also served adults returning for further education and training. In 1931 and 1952, commercial buildings were added along the south side of Wichita High School East and adjacent Grove Street to provide training in the professional and industrial arts. Between 1952 and 1968, around 600 students enrolled in various vocational courses there every year. In the summer of 1968, the district chose this site to open the Grove Campus of its Wichita Area Vocational-Technical School (WAVTS) Vocational Technical Center (1996, officially, Wichita Area Technical College. Under a separate administration, the facility offered training to both students and adults in 18 different sectors of trade and industry. [25] In 1953, bowing to decades of pressure from West Wichitans, the District built the first high school in West Wichita-Wichita High School West, which, at the time of its inception, was primarily a vocational technical school (initially, only 22% of West High graduates went on to college). As a result, The West High curriculum initially emphasized academics rather than professional preparation. A large housebuilding department taught students family budgets, food preparation, child care and family ties. The school's business Education Department taught secretarial training, stenography, retail sailing and business. An industrial education department taught woodworking, metalworking, auto mechanics, electrical work, printing, mechanical drawing and other trades. However, the school eventually became a regular academic high school, which is today. [25] From 1965 to 2004, Wichita Public Schools conducted a system of vocational and continuing education that consisted largely: [25][26] [27] School of Vocational Education (officially wichita area vocational-technical school- WAVTS (popularly pronounced wow-vits) -- on Wichita High School; and the School of Continuing Education (in the original Wichita High School building on Third and Amporia streets— until 1970, the Central Vocational School was designated, the Central Vocational Building (CVB) until 1984, and until 1996, the WATC Central Campus). By 1973, wichita area vocational technical school had become the largest Schools in Wichita, with more than 5,000 people enrolled in their classes each year. Vavas had expanded his vocational training from the initial craft, which included advanced industrial skills such as estimates, procurement, production line setup and production determination. Concurrently, traditional home economics courses were still being taught in secondary schools across the system, but were expanded to provide professional food service skills. An additional WAVTS campus was set up at Wichita Municipal Airport to teach aircraft maintenance and provide training for businesses in aviation, the flagship industry of Wichita. However, difficulties between the aviation industry and WAVTS led local industry leaders to invite Cowley County Community College to set up a substitute facility in the east Cessna aircraft area in southeast Wichita.>[29] In 1987, the Wichita-area vocational technical school partnered with Butler County Community College to develop an associate of applied science degree in electronic engineering technology. A technical school could

not offer an associate degree, so a partnership with Butler was necessary. At the request of Wichita community business leaders in late 1990, Wichita State University and the Technical School partnered to offer this degree through WSU, and the agreement and degree were approved by the Kansas Board of Regents in 1991[30] In 19, WAVTS was renamed Wichita Area Technical College (WATC) , and the college obtained the right to give college credit to the college, and the college college had the right to give college credits, and the right to give an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree. [26] In 2004, however, after strained relations between the local industry and the WATC, wichita public school (USD 259) board of education excluded the WATC from USD 259- and the WATC became an independent public college, governed by its own board, the Sedgwick County Technical Education and Training Authority. [26] [29] [31] After the district's disinvestment of 2004 vavts (as WATC), Cowley's aviation training facility was acquired by WATC— then in 2010, with the National Centre for Aviation Training (NCAT) at Jabara Airport in Wichita, replaced by the WATC. [26] [29] In 2001, an additional addition was added to the Levy Special Education Center, which included a vocational training center for the developmentally disabled.
