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## Sunset campground map union valley reservoir

In a position to enjoy the stunning sunset over Union Valley Reservoir, the camp site has many locations on the beach. Sunsets are generally open from mid-May to mid-October. About half of the sites are for campers who come first. Others may be booked at least 4 days before your

arrival. Check your prices, availability and booking on Recreation.gov/sunset.131 Camps range from fully shaded to full sun in this forest editing area at an altitude of 5,000 feet. There is a boat ramp with an accessible indoor pier on site, a paved parking area, a dumping station, cellar toilets, dumps, drinking water and a swimming beach. Sailing, boating and swimming are very popular. Hikers and motorcyclists enjoy exploring the bike path at Union Valley and Passy Falls for hiking. The bike path connects to the camps, near the boat ramp, and runs for 4.8 miles along the eastern shores of the lake. Fishing in the lake includes rainbow, brown, mackinaw trout and cocani salmon. Enjoy our virtual tour of Sunset Camp below and read more camping in the Union Valley area: The Pacific Sunset Ranger Campground is a large camping area along the eastern side of the Union Valley Reservoir in the Crystal Basin area of El Dorado National Forest. The camps are separated from 131 to 3 episodes - Sunset, Meadow, and Shady. Sunset Campground is set in a cedar and pine ponderosa forest with beautiful views of the lake. The camps are located near the beach, the launch slope, and the paved bike trail that follows around the lakeshore for 41/2 miles. Camping sites may be booked at Sunset Campground, while a number of sites may be available from first come, serve first. Of all the sites, only 30 are tent sites. There are a number of dual sites that can accommodate up to 12 people. From early September until early October all camps are available first, served first. The sunset camp group that can accommodate 30 pople and 10 vehicles. The site is accessible to ADA. The price is \$140 per night. The map shown above is for illustrative purposes only. Sunset A large camp with beach access on the peninsula extends to the scenic Union Valley reservoir under the umbrella of ponderosa pine. The camp is located at an altitude of about 4,900 feet in California's El Dorado National Forest. Sunset camp has 131 camps, including only 30 camp camps. Union Valley Bike Trail is close to the camp and offers several miles of paved cycling and walking around the picturesque reservoir. In addition, there is a boat ramp near the entrance to the camp, like nearby Vashuda Camp, and the other 10 camps surrounding the Union Valley Reservoir, are jointly managed by El Dorado National Forest and Sacramento Utility Management Area (SMUD) as part of the Recreation Area of the Crystal Basin. Union Valley Reservoir offers access to boats, canoeing and swimming, and has some wonderful rocky beaches to relax. All of the sunset camps include a picnic table, a fire ring, and access to bathrooms. Showers are nearby in Fashoda camp. The nearest place to buy supplies is 5 miles away at Ice House Reservoir. Camp online sunset camp reservations - down the sunset line camp is a great campsite, mostly among our favorite camps that we used. There are three main episodes in camp, the Shady Loop, the Meadow Loop, and the Sunset Loop. Located somewhat on a small hill, Shady Loop does not offer direct access to the beach from the campsite. Meadow Loop is located on the arrival beach, with 3 camping sites right next to the beach. However these 3 camps with access to the beach are also next to the baths, which kind of ruins the best camps on the loop. The sunset ring is the best of 3 rings, with copious amounts of beach access on three sides of the camp, as it is located at the tip of the peninsula in the middle of the Union Valley reservoir. All three episodes really pack people in the camp. There is very little privacy at sunset because of the little ground cover to provide barriers between the camps. You can see and hear your neighbors fairly easily. However, Union Valley Reservoir and water activities are a big drag here, so if you have a boat this is a great place to take it with you in camping, where the reservoir is not used heavily, especially in late spring and early summer. The warm weather is great to relax on the beach next to the campsite. The location could not be found. What to do is boats, canoeing, & amp; canoeing – the Union Valley reservoir is directly accessible from Sunset Camp, and the boat stairwell is less than 1 mile from the campsite. Hiking – mountain biking – Valley Valley Union Trail is not far from the sunset camp and connects many camps around the reservoir. Relax on the beach - a large rocky beach next to the campsite, which is great for relaxation. 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
