## Fukkatsu no lelouch ending scene

One of the most important things about Code Geass: Lelouch the Re:urrection is that it is not a sequel to the 2006 television series, but rather of the compilation films that came out in Japan during 2017 and 2018. This allows anyone who doesn't like the way things unfold in the new film the ability to ignore it because it's not technically in continuity with the series they know and love. And while this may seem great at first, this is actually a double-edged sword that inadvertently makes the TV series even darker. **\*\*Spoiler Warning: This article contains spoilers for the Code Geass TV series, the three compilation films and the new original film.\*\*** Image source:エドナ: Most of these are cuts due to the compendium process. It also has some lines in the closing narration. And while she and Jeremiah send a letter to C.C. in the epilogue asking her to come by, Sheryl's inclusion doesn't seem to affect the story much. So did Jeremiah, as he had to let Suzaku pass over him and the retreat sounded once the bad dictator was gone. However, while Lelouch and Suzaku were prepared to end up with Lelouch dead in a pool of blood next to Nunnally, C.C. was not. With Lelouch, C.C. she had finally found a true partner, a person who promised her the desire of her heart: to be loved. Now, although I wasn't going to interfere with the Zero Requiem Plan, I'd be doomed if I let Lelouch go without a fight. Therefore, she drew up a plan to save him. Like her, Jeremiah did not want to see Lelouch killed, so he became his co-conspirator. Also, as anyone in a zero suit could command Schneizel, it could also be used. In turn, he is about to save both Suzaku and Nunnally from the forces of the Kingdom of Zilkistan. But soon Lelouch discovers that Chamma, queen of Zilkistan, has built a machine to let her into the world of C, but also has her own Geass which is much more powerful than anyone she has encountered before: the power to go back in time six hours when you die. In the end, it's safe to say that no one but Lelouch would have a chance to beat her, and that's what makes the series end up much darker. Overall, the state of the world is identical in both the TV series and the summary films. And since the only major change seems to be Shirley's continued existence, that implies that all the events we see in Lelouch the Re:urrection would still occur in the continuity of the TV series. However, without Shirley, it is almost certain that Lelouch would have been dead, and this is only the first in a long line of dominoes that spells doom for our heroes. In other words, all the sacrifices Lelouch made to achieve world peace—his reputation, his soul, and millions of human lives—were in vain in the end. Whether he used his geass on you or not when you saw him, you forced yourself to pay attention. Thanks to Ichiro Okouchi's conscious approach to history, he is one who has endured the test for more than a decade and still maintains a devoted fan base. Code Geass aimed to create the story of a young man willing to do anything to make his world better for those he loved, and, like that young man, the show was firm, especially in his final act: Lelouch's death, and then Lelouch de la Re:urrection brought him back. Lelouch has still been killed, and Nunnally is still on the throne of Britannia, but the key to saving Lelouch turns out to be Shirley losing her complex love story in high school and a need to burden her father's death. In a series that depended on creating complications for their characters, it's a shame that the only way they could conceive of Lelouch surviving was through one of his best female characters. 7 Without Lelouch surviving, Nunnally probably would have been killed Lelouch surviving seems to have nothing to do with Nunnally being captured and Suzaku being unable to save her, but, without him, the chances of her escaping were low. Because this is not a direct sequel to the series, it is impossible to say that Nunnally would have been kidnapped on that mission of goodwill, but it seems likely. Also, as they faced someone who had the ability to travel back in time when he died, without Lelouch's unmatched strategic prowess, it's hard to believe nunnally didn't end up dying in the main reality. So everyone should thank Shirley for stealing a body. 6 They made an alternate universe where C.C. Cared Just A Little More 2019 was a great year for alternate universe mischief thanks to the fourth film in the Avengers: Avengers Endgame series. For Ichiro Okouchi's credit, he had been with the three summary films that preceded Lelouch de la Re:urrection. But the secret to the turn that people had been debating for years unless Lelouch died with no intention of survival. He hadn't stolen the Code from his father, and it wasn't activated when he had Suzaku kill him. Although she implies that she may have been captured, she still shows that she was a capable ruler, deserving of a place as Lelouch's successor. 4 In danger the message which Lelouch's death remained for him is not about the relationships which the fans have with the work. It is common sense that, if Lelouch's plan was to unite the world around the destruction of an evil emperor, then, if he is walking the world, it will be a problem if people discover that his death was a lie. There doesn't seem to be any social network for anyone to simply tweet about Lelouch Lamperouge, famous murdered emperor of Britannia, walking, but the plan is now in danger of being undone. 3 Makes more sense C.C. was not the most active character in the main series plot. For the most part, she was pleased to see what Lelouch would do with a power that had caused her so much damage and loneliness. In shape, that's a big part of his arch of history, being shown that the curse he thought he was carrying wasn't exactly as it seemed. However, if C.C. was meant to be in love with Lelouch all the time, it's hard to accept that she wouldn't try to stop her from enacting her plan, or at least reaching one of her own so that they could both get what they want. Creating this alternate universe where C.C. is responsible for her resurrection gives her a agency she didn't quite have before. 2 Broke the creator's hard-running hard line At the end of the film, the implication is that Lelouch will still be dead. He renounces his name and begins to follow L.L.'s initials to imply that while he may have returned, he will not return to his old ways. And, with Nunnally saved and Suzaku becoming zero again, then things are back on the road to the peace Lelouch wanted. Then what had to die in the first place? Instead, he gave us a C.C that seemed to have found happiness thanks to Lelouch but didn't need to be with him. As stated above, although the C.C. of this universe is less satisfied with letting Lelouch make the decisions, he did not consider it in terms of killing himself, so she saw no need to take into account her feeling by bringing him back to life, and seeing him change his name for her was frankly adorable.
